A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR PERSONS WHO ARE
102 ENROLLED IN A MEDICAID WAIVER PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing (department) to create and implement an expedited provider enrollment approval process and an expedited review of qualifications for transportation service providers for medicaid waiver recipients (providers) no later than July 1, 2021.

The bill requires the department to engage in a stakeholder process

to develop a report that identifies barriers and potential solutions to medicaid waiver recipients accessing transportation services within the long-term support and services system and to submit the report to specified committees of the general assembly no later than January 15, 2021.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds that: 4 (a) Individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities 5 (IDD) deserve an opportunity to live, work, play, and perform everyday 6 activities in a community of their choice, at the time of their choosing, 7 wherever and whenever possible; 8 (b) Coloradans with IDD are unemployed and underemployed at 9 a higher rate than the general population and often live in relative 10 isolation due to myriad barriers and disincentives despite their interest 11 and eagerness to work and engage in the community; 12 (c) Colorado is an employment first state committed to addressing 13 barriers and disincentives to employment to ensure that all Coloradans 14 can access meaningful, competitive integrated employment; 15 (d) Meaningful employment and day habilitation services, whether 16 accessed separately or jointly, foster independence and allow adults with 17 IDD to make meaningful connections in their community; 18 (e) For adults with IDD, transportation represents a significant 19 barrier to accessing employment in the community and day habilitation 20 services; 21 (f) Many adults with IDD are reliant on transportation available 22 through the home and community-based developmental disabilities 23 waiver or the home and community-based supported living services

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1	waiver to gain access to the community, including employment,
2	(g) Traditional methods of transportation outlined in the waivers
3	are often inefficient and overburdened;
4	(h) For the past decade, Colorado, following national trends, has
5	experienced a shortage in direct service providers, including
6	transportation service providers;
7	(i) Even where accessible public transportation exists, adults with
8	IDD and service providers consider current transportation options
9	inadequate;
10	(j) The current enrollment and approval process for contracting
11	with new transportation service providers is inefficient and adds further
12	barriers to sufficient, safe, and timely service delivery;
13	(k) The current reimbursement methodology for transportation
14	services is complex and insufficient for improving provider capacity; and
15	(l) Adults with IDD require workplace and day habilitation
16	transportation that is safe, efficient, and cost effective.

18	that Colorado allow for flexibility and growth in available transportation
19	options for adults with IDD at comparable costs and funded as an
20	alternative to mass transportation in a way that maintains safety and

11	IDENTIFIES BARRIERS AND POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS TO ACCESSING
12	TRANSPORTATION SERVICES WITHIN THE LONG-TERM SUPPORT AND
13	SERVICES SYSTEM. THE REPORT MUST ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING ISSUES

4	PUBLIC HEALTH CARE AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE AND HEALTH

7	SECTION 9. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
8	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

10	5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a
11	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
