A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE INCREASED MONEY RECEIVED DUE TO THE FEDERAL
102	"FAMILIES FIRST CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE ACT", AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AND REDUCING
104	APPROPRIATIONS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov/</u>.)

Joint Budget Committee. For fiscal years 2019-20 and 2020-21, the bill specifies that:

If a provider or a school district submits a certification of

public expenditure pursuant to federal law, the provider, or school district shall receive federal matching funds in the amount of 50% of the amount certified, and any federal financial participation in excess of 50% of the amount certified must be transferred to the general fund for the medical assistance program;

- ! The amount of increased federal financial participation in excess of 50% generated from appropriations out of the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund must be used to offset other general fund appropriations for the medical assistance program;
- ! The amount of increased federal financial participation in excess of 50% for reimbursements and payments must be transferred from the medicaid nursing facility cash fund to the general fund for the medical assistance program expenditures; and
- Provide the university of Colorado for fee-for-service contracts for health services is reduced by the amount of federal financial participation that exceeds 50%.

- 3 as follows:

4 25.5-3-108. Responsibility of the department of health care 5 policy and financing - provider reimbursement - repeal. 6 (19) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, FOR THE 7 STATE FISCAL YEARS COMMENCING JULY 1, 2019, AND JULY 1, 2020, IF A 8 PROVIDER SUBMITS A CERTIFICATION OF PUBLIC EXPENDITURES PURSUANT 9 TO 42 CFR 433.51 (b), THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL RETAIN ANY 10 FEDERAL MONEY PAYABLE AS REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE IN 11 EXCESS OF FIFTY PERCENT OF THE EXPENDITURE AMOUNT. THE STATE 12 TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER SUCH MONEY TO THE GENERAL FUND 13 CREATED IN SECTION 24-75-201 FOR APPROPRIATION FOR THE STATE 14 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

6 Hospitals - healthcare affordability and 25.5-4-402.4. 7 sustainability fee - legislative declaration - Colorado healthcare 8 affordability and sustainability enterprise - federal waiver - fund 9 created - rules - reports - repeal. (4) Healthcare affordability and 10 sustainability fee. (a) For the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2017, and 11 for each fiscal year thereafter, the enterprise is authorized to charge and 12 collect a healthcare affordability and sustainability fee, as described in 42 13 CFR 433.68 (b), on outpatient and inpatient services provided by all 14 licensed or certified hospitals, referred to in this section as "hospitals", for 15 the purpose of obtaining federal financial participation under the state 16 medical assistance program as described in this article 4 and articles 5 and 17 6 of this title 25.5, referred to in this section as the "state medical 18 assistance program", and the Colorado indigent care program described 19 in part 1 of article 3 of this title 25.5, referred to in this section as the 20 "Colorado indigent care program". The enterprise shall use the healthcare 21 affordability and sustainability fee revenue to:

(II.5) (A) FOR STATE FISCAL YEARS 2019-20 AND 2020-21 ONLY,
OFFSET GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES FOR THE STATE MEDICAL
ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

(5) Healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund.

(b) All money in the fund is subject to federal matching as authorized
under federal law and, subject to annual appropriation by the general
assembly, shall be expended by the enterprise for the following purposes:

4 (VIII) Subject to any necessary federal waivers being obtained, to
5 provide funding for a health care delivery system reform incentive
6 payments program as described in subsection (8) of this section; and

7 (VIII.5) (A) FOR STATE FISCAL YEARS 2019-20 AND 2020-21 8 ONLY, AND REGARDLESS OF WHEN THIS FEDERAL MONEY IS MADE 9 AVAILABLE, THE AMOUNT IN EXCESS OF THE FIFTY PERCENT FEDERAL 10 FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION GENERATED BY INCREASED REIMBURSEMENTS 11 AND PAYMENTS APPROPRIATED FOR USE IN SUBSECTIONS (5)(b)(I) TO 12 (5)(b)(III) OF THIS SECTION PURSUANT TO THE FEDERAL "FAMILIES FIRST 13 CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE ACT", PUB.L. 116-127, OR ANY AMENDMENT 14 THERETO, TO OFFSET GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES FOR THE STATE 15 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

16 (B) THIS SUBSECTION (5)(b)(VIII.5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE
17 DECEMBER 31, 2021.

18 (6) **Appropriations.** (a) (I) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN 19 SUBSECTION (6)(b)(I.5) OF THIS SECTION, the healthcare affordability and 20 sustainability fee is to supplement, not supplant, general fund 21 appropriations to support hospital reimbursements. General fund 22 appropriations for hospital reimbursements shall be maintained at the 23 level of appropriations in the medical services premium line item made 24 for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2008; except that general fund 25 appropriations for hospital reimbursements may be reduced if an index of 26 appropriations to other providers shows that general fund appropriations 27 are reduced for other providers. If the index shows that general fund

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appropriations are reduced for other providers, the general fund
appropriations for hospital reimbursements shall not be reduced by a
greater percentage than the reductions of appropriations for the other
providers as shown by the index.

(2) (b) (VII) (A) NOTWITHSTANDING 21 ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SUBSECTION (2)(b), FOR STATE MEDICAID 22 EXPENDITURES FOR STATE FISCAL YEARS 2019-20 AND 2020-21 ONLY, AND 23 REGARDLESS OF WHEN THIS FEDERAL MONEY IS MADE AVAILABLE, MONEY 24 IN THE FUND MAY BE USED TO OFFSET GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES IN 25 THE MEDICAID PROGRAM IN AN EQUIVALENT AMOUNT THAT WOULD HAVE 26 BEEN IN EXCESS OF THE FIFTY PERCENT FEDERAL FINANCIAL 27 PARTICIPATION GENERATED BY INCREASED REIMBURSEMENTS AND

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SECTION 6. Appropriation - adjustments to 2020 long bill.
 (1) To implement this act, appropriations made in the annual general
 appropriation act for the 2020-21 state fiscal year to the department of
 health care policy and financing are adjusted as follows:

(a) The general fund appropriation, which is subject to the "(M)" notation as defined in the annual general appropriation act for the same

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fiscal year, for medical services premiums is decreased by \$24,733,945;
(b) The appropriation for medical services premiums is reduced
by \$2,021,766. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds received
from the department of higher education under subsection (2)(b) of this
section;

(c) The appropriation for medical services premiums is increased
by \$24,733,945, which consists of \$21,132,815 from the healthcare
affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in section
25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., and \$3,601,130 from the medicaid nursing
facility cash fund created in section 25.5-6-203 (2)(a), C.R.S.; and

(d) The decrease of the appropriation in subsection (1)(b) of this
section is based on the assumption that the anticipated amount of federal
funds received for the 2020-21 state fiscal year by the department of
health care policy and financing for medical services premiums will
decrease by \$2,289,036.

- (2) To implement this act, appropriations made in the annual
 general appropriation act for the 2020-21 state fiscal year to the
 department of higher education are adjusted as follows:
- (a) The general fund appropriation for fee-for-service contracts
 with state institutions for specialty education programs is decreased by
 \$2,021,766; and

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(b) The appropriation for the regents of the university of Colorado
 is reduced by \$2,021,766. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds
 received from the department of higher education under subsection (2)(a)
 of this section.

5 SECTION 7. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
6 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
