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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING LEGISLATIVE INTERIM COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES, AND, IN**  
102            **CONNECTION THEREWITH, SUSPENDING LEGISLATIVE INTERIM**  
103            **ACTIVITIES DURING THE 2020 INTERIM, CHANGING THE**  
104            **MINIMUM NUMBER OF MEETINGS THAT THE EARLY CHILDHOOD**  
105            **AND SCHOOL READINESS LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION MUST HOLD**  
106            **TO BE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF MEETINGS ANNUALLY THAT**  
107            **THE COMMISSION MAY HOLD, AND REDUCING AN**  
108            **APPROPRIATION.**

**Executive Committee of the Legislative Council.** The bill suspends legislative interim committee activities during the 2020 interim. Specifically, the bill:

- ! Prohibits the legislative council of the general assembly from prioritizing any requests for legislative interim committees, including task forces, for the 2020 interim; and
- ! Prohibits meetings, field trips, and legislative recommendations and reports by, and suspends for one year certain reports required to be submitted to, existing legislative interim committees, including the Colorado youth advisory council review committee; wildfire matters review committee; statewide health care review committee; Colorado health insurance exchange oversight committee; pension review commission and pension review subcommittee; early childhood and school readiness legislative commission; water resources review committee; and transportation legislation review committee.

Additionally, the bill removes the requirement that the early childhood and school readiness legislative commission meet at least 4 times each year and instead limits the commission to up to 4 meetings per year.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-303.3, **add** (3)(d)  
3 as follows:

4 **2-3-303.3. Interim committees - repeal.**

5 (3) (d) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, THE  
6 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SHALL NOT PRIORITIZE ANY INTERIM COMMITTEES  
7 OR APPROVE ANY TASK FORCES FOR THE 2020 INTERIM. NOTHING IN THIS  
8 SUBSECTION (3)(d) PROHIBITS THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE  
9 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, WHETHER BEFORE OR AFTER THE GENERAL  
10 ASSEMBLY HAS ADJOURNED, FROM APPROVING AN INTERIM COMMITTEE BY  
11 RESOLUTION FOR THE 2020 INTERIM IN THE MANNER SPECIFIED IN  
12 SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS SECTION.

1 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (3)(d) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

2 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-2-1304, **amend**  
3 (6)(b) as follows:

4 **2-2-1304. Duties - meetings - community outreach -**  
5 **designation of organization to accept donations - authority to**  
6 **contract - repeal.** (6) (b) On or before ~~April 30, 2020~~ APRIL 30, 2021,  
7 and on or before April 30 of each year thereafter, the council shall select  
8 five members to serve as nonvoting members of the review committee  
9 during the subsequent legislative interim.

10 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-2-1305.5, **amend**  
11 (3)(b), (5), and (6) as follows:

12 **2-2-1305.5. Colorado youth advisory council review committee**  
13 **- created - repeal.** (3) (b) On or before ~~April 30, 2020~~ APRIL 30, 2021,  
14 and on or before April 30 of each year thereafter, the chair of the  
15 legislative council shall appoint the member serving pursuant to  
16 subsection (2)(a)(II) of this section to serve during the subsequent  
17 legislative interim.

18 (5) (a) The review committee may meet up to three times during  
19 each interim but may not travel unless authorized by the executive  
20 committee of the legislative council. A majority of voting members  
21 constitutes a quorum.

22 (b) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (5)(a) OF THIS SECTION,  
23 THE REVIEW COMMITTEE SHALL NOT MEET OR TRAVEL DURING THE 2020  
24 INTERIM.

25 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (5)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

26 (6) (a) The review committee may recommend up to a total of  
27 three bills during each interim. Legislation recommended by the review

1 committee must be treated as legislation recommended by an interim  
2 committee for purposes of applicable deadlines, bill introduction limits,  
3 and any other requirements imposed by the joint rules of the general  
4 assembly.

5 (b) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (6)(a) OF THIS SECTION,  
6 THE REVIEW COMMITTEE MAY NOT RECOMMEND LEGISLATION DURING THE  
7 2020 INTERIM.

8 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (6)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

9 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1602, **amend** (1)  
10 and (4.5) as follows:

11 **2-3-1602. Wildfire matters review committee - creation -**  
12 **repeal - repeal of part.** (1) (a) To address wildfire prevention and  
13 mitigation and to review and propose legislation relating to such matters,  
14 the wildfire matters review committee is hereby created, and is referred  
15 to in this part 16 as the "committee". The committee shall meet at the call  
16 of the chair at least once during the interim of each year to review and to  
17 propose legislation or other policy changes relating to wildfire prevention  
18 and mitigation and all related matters, including, without limitation,  
19 public safety, forest health, and cooperation with appropriate federal  
20 agencies and local governments. The committee may take up to two field  
21 trips during the interim and consult with experts in all fields relating to  
22 wildfire prevention and mitigation as may be necessary to achieve the  
23 objectives of this part 16. All personnel of any state agency or political  
24 subdivision of Colorado involved in wildfire prevention and mitigation,  
25 including the Colorado department of public safety and the Colorado state  
26 forest service, shall cooperate with the committee and with any persons  
27 assisting the committee in carrying out its duties pursuant to this section.

1 (b) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION,  
2 THE COMMITTEE SHALL NOT MEET OR TAKE FIELD TRIPS DURING THE 2020  
3 INTERIM.

4 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

5 (4.5) (a) The committee may recommend up to a total of five bills  
6 during each interim. Legislation recommended by the committee must be  
7 treated as legislation recommended by an interim committee for purposes  
8 of applicable deadlines, bill introduction limits, and any other  
9 requirements imposed by the joint rules of the general assembly.

10 (b) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (4.5)(a) OF THIS SECTION,  
11 THE COMMITTEE MAY NOT RECOMMEND LEGISLATION DURING THE 2020  
12 INTERIM.

13 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (4.5)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,  
14 2021.

15 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-1233,  
16 **amend** (6)(b) as follows:

17 **24-33.5-1233. Colorado fire commission - creation - powers**  
18 **and duties - report - legislative declaration - repeal. (6) Reports.**

19 (b) On or before ~~August 31, 2020~~ AUGUST 31, 2021, and on or before  
20 August 31 each year thereafter, the commission shall report to the  
21 wildfire matters review committee on its activities and recommendations.

22 **SECTION 6.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-221, **amend**  
23 (3) as follows:

24 **10-16-221. Statewide health care review committee - creation**  
25 **- membership - duties - repeal. (3) (a)** The committee shall meet no  
26 more than two times each legislative interim, unless additional meetings  
27 are authorized by the executive committee of the legislative council. Of

1 the meetings authorized under this subsection (3), the committee may take  
2 up to two field trips per year in connection with its duties mandated under  
3 this section.

4 (b) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION,  
5 THE COMMITTEE SHALL NOT MEET OR TAKE FIELD TRIPS DURING THE 2020  
6 INTERIM.

7 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (3)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

8 **SECTION 7.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-22-107, **amend**  
9 (1) and (5) as follows:

10 **10-22-107. Colorado health insurance exchange oversight**  
11 **committee - creation - duties - repeal.** (1) (a) For the purposes of  
12 guiding implementation of an exchange in Colorado, making  
13 recommendations to the general assembly, and ensuring that the interests  
14 of Coloradans are protected and furthered, there is hereby created the  
15 Colorado health insurance exchange oversight committee. The committee  
16 shall meet ~~on or before August 1, 2011, and thereafter~~ at the call of the  
17 chair at least two times during each calendar year, but no more than seven  
18 times during each calendar year when the general assembly is not in  
19 session. The committee may meet an unlimited number of times at the call  
20 of the chair when the general assembly is in session. The committee may  
21 use the legislative council staff to assist its members in researching any  
22 matters.

12 (6) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, NEITHER THE  
13 COMMISSION NOR THE SUBCOMMITTEE SHALL MEET DURING THE 2020  
14 INTERIM, AND LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE ARE NOT  
15 REQUIRED TO ATTEND THE MEETINGS AND HEARINGS SPECIFIED IN  
16 SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION DURING THE 2020 INTERIM. HOWEVER,  
17 IF A LEGISLATIVE MEMBER OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE ATTENDS A MEETING OR  
18 HEARING SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION DURING THE 2020  
19 INTERIM, THE LEGISLATIVE MEMBER IS NOT ENTITLED TO PER DIEM. THE  
20 SUBCOMMITTEE IS NOT REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE REVIEW AND  
21 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION  
22 DURING THE 2020 INTERIM.

23 (b) THIS SUBSECTION (6) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

24 **SECTION 9.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-6.5-203, **amend**  
25 (2)(a) and (2)(c) as follows:

26 **26-6.5-203. Early childhood and school readiness legislative**  
27 **commission - creation - membership - duties - funding - repeal.**

1 (2) (a) (I) The commission may meet ~~at least~~ UP TO four times annually.  
2 The director of research of the legislative council and the director of the  
3 office of legislative legal services shall provide staff assistance to the  
4 ~~interim committee~~ COMMISSION. The commission shall study issues  
5 concerning early childhood and school readiness, including but not  
6 limited to health care, mental health, parental involvement, family  
7 support, child care, and early learning. The commission shall solicit input  
8 from members of the public, especially those individuals with expertise  
9 related to early childhood and school readiness issues, to aid the  
10 commission in its work. The commission shall consult with the early  
11 childhood leadership commission, created in section 26-6.2-103, with  
12 regard to policies concerning early childhood and school readiness.

18 the date specified in joint rule 24 (b)(1)(D). The report may include  
19 recommendations for legislation, including but not limited to legislation  
20 continuing the commission and an explanation of the additional time and  
21 procedures that the commission may require to achieve the commission's  
22 study goals. Legislation that the commission recommends shall be treated  
23 as legislation recommended by an interim committee for the purposes of  
24 the introduction deadlines and bill limitations imposed by the joint rules  
25 of the senate and house of representatives.

26 (II) (A) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (2)(c)(I) OF THIS  
27 SECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL NEITHER REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE

1 COUNCIL NOR RECOMMEND LEGISLATION DURING THE 2020 INTERIM.

2 (B) THIS SUBSECTION (2)(c)(II) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,

4 **SECTION 10.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 37-98-102, **amend**  
5 (1)(a) as follows:

6 **37-98-102. Water resources review committee - creation -**  
7 **repeal.** (1) (a) (I) For the purposes of contributing to and monitoring the  
8 conservation, use, development, and financing of the water resources of  
9 Colorado for the general welfare of its inhabitants and to review and  
10 propose water resources legislation, there is hereby created the water  
11 resources review committee, referred to in this ~~article~~ ARTICLE 98 as the  
12 "committee". The committee shall meet at the call of the chair as often as  
13 six times during even-numbered years and eight times during  
14 odd-numbered years to review and to propose water resources legislation  
15 and matters relating thereto. No more than two of such meetings may  
16 occur ~~during periods other than the interim period; except that the~~  
17 ~~committee shall not meet during the 2010 interim period~~ WHILE THE  
18 GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS IN SESSION. In connection with such review, ~~except~~  
19 ~~during the 2010 interim period;~~ the committee may take up to two field  
20 trips per year in connection with its mandate and shall consult with  
21 experts in the field of water conservation, quality, use, finance, and  
22 development. The department of natural resources, the state engineer, and  
23 the attorney general, together with the members and staff of the Colorado  
24 water conservation board, the Colorado water resources and power  
25 development authority, the ~~Colorado~~ water quality control commission,

8 (B) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(a)(II) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,  
9 2021.

10 **SECTION 11.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 37-98-103, **amend**  
11 (1) as follows:

12 **37-98-103. Annual recommendations - bill limitation -**  
13 **deadlines for introduction - repeal.** (1) (a) The committee may report  
14 no more than three bills or other measures to the legislative council  
15 created in section 2-3-301 ~~C.R.S.~~, unless a two-thirds majority of the  
16 members of the committee vote to report a greater number. ~~except that the~~  
17 ~~committee shall not report any bills to the legislative council in 2010.~~ No  
18 bill shall be reported to the legislative council unless a two-thirds majority  
19 of the appointed members of the committee vote to report such bill to the  
20 legislative council. Such greater number shall not exceed one bill or other  
21 measure per member. These bills shall be exempt from any applicable bill  
22 limit imposed on the individual committee members sponsoring such bills  
23 if the bills have been approved by the legislative council no later than  
24 October 15 in even-numbered years and November 15 in odd-numbered  
25 years.

6 **groundwater administration and management pilot projects - report**  
7 **- repeal.** (f) The board, in consultation with the state engineer, shall  
8 annually report to the water resources review committee, created in  
9 section 37-98-102, or its successor committee, on the reported results of  
10 the pilot projects. The board, in consultation with the state engineer, shall  
11 provide a final report to the water resources review committee or its  
12 successor committee by ~~September 1, 2020~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2021.

13 (g) This subsection (10) is repealed, effective ~~July 1, 2021~~ JULY  
14 1, 2022.

20 and may consult with experts in the fields of traffic regulation, the  
21 licensing of drivers, the registration and titling of motor vehicles, and  
22 highway construction and planning and may consult with the personnel  
23 of the department of transportation or the department of revenue as may  
24 be necessary. ~~except that the committee shall not meet during the 2010~~  
25 ~~interim.~~ All personnel of the department of transportation, THE  
26 department of revenue, or any state agency or political subdivision of  
27 Colorado that regulates motor vehicles or traffic shall cooperate with the

1 committee and with any persons assisting the committee in carrying out  
2 its duties pursuant to this section. The committee may review any phase  
3 of department of transportation operations, including planning and  
4 construction of highway projects, prior to and during the completion of  
5 such projects.

11 **SECTION 14. Appropriation to the legislative department for**  
12 **the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020. Amend as added by House Bill**  
13 **20-1345 section 1 (1)(a)(I) as follows:**

14 Section 1. Appropriation. (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year,  
15 \$50,753,612 \$50,652,745 is appropriated to the legislative department.  
16 This appropriation consists of \$49,517,990 \$49,417,123 from the general  
17 fund, \$90,000 from cash funds, and \$1,145,622 from reappropriated  
18 funds. The legislative department may use this appropriation as follows:

19 (a) \$17,518,829 \$17,417,962 for use by the general assembly,  
20 which amount:

21 (I) Consists of \$17,428,829 \$17,327,962 from the general fund  
22 and \$90,000 from cash funds generated from the sale of bill boxes,  
23 legislative directories, and publications and other services provided by the  
24 print shop; and

25 **SECTION 15. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
26 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
