The bill would have required administrative units to adopt policies related to behavior analysts who provide medically necessary services to students during school hours. The bill would have increased school district workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation would have been required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this fiscal note do not take effect

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires that administrative units adopt a policy concerning behavior analysts who provide medically necessary services to students during school hours. School district boards of education must solicit input on the policy from parents and community members in public at a regularly scheduled board meeting, and must post the policy on the district's website.

School District

Beginning in FY 2020-21, the bill increases workload for school districts, boards of cooperative educational services (BOCES), and the state Charter School Institute (CSI) to conduct outreach to parents and community members, and to adopt and implement a policy. Workload will vary based on the current policies of school districts, BOCES, and the CSI.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Education Committee on May 27, 2020.
