The bill increases the membership of the Board of Trustees at Fort Lewis College. The bill minimally increases expenditures for the college on an ongoing basis.

**Appropriation  
Summary:** No appropriation is required.

**Fiscal Note  
Status:** This final fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

## Summary of Legislation

Under current law, the nine-member Board of Trustees of Fort Lewis College consists of seven voting members and two non-voting members. This bill adds two voting members, increasing the total size of the board to 11. Of the nine voting members of the board, no more than five members may be from one political party; at least one member must be an enrolled member of a federally recognized Native American tribe; and at least two members must reside in Archuleta, Dolores, La Plata, Montezuma, or San Juan county, or reside on the Ute Mountain Ute or Southern Ute reservation.

## State Expenditures

The bill minimally increases Board of Trustee expenses at Fort Lewis College to compensate additional trustees for reasonable travel expenses. The bill does not increase appropriations.

## Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect March 24, 2011.\*\*
