	The bill allows state agencies to broadly construe the requirement to issue a request for proposals as any competitive solicitation method allowed by law. It minimally decreases workload in state agencies on an ongoing basis.

## **Summary of Legislation**

When a state agency is required by law to issue a request for proposals (RFP) pursuant to the Colorado Procurement Code, the bill allows the agency to instead issue any competitive solicitation method allowed by the code, as the agency deems most appropriate and efficient.

## **State Expenditures**

To the extent that a state agency employs a different competitive solicitation method than an RFP, it may experience a reduction in workload. As any reduction is assumed to be minimal, and no change in appropriations is required.

### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect August 5, 2020, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2020, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
