Bill Topic: **EMPLOYEE AGE TO SELL ALCOHOL RETAIL LIQUOR STORE**

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill modifies employee age requirements for retail liquor stores and liquor-licensed drugstores, which does not impact state or local revenue or expenditures.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires that employees of retail liquor stores and liquor-licensed drugstores who are between the ages of 18 and 21 be supervised by an employee who is at least 21 years old in order to sell alcohol. The bill also clarifies that employees of liquor-licensed drugstores who are between 18 and 21 years of age may not deliver alcohol, but may sell and otherwise have contact with alcohol.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill does not change the workload, revenue, or expenditures for any state or local government agency. The bill modifies employee age requirements for private businesses, and is not expected to change the number of, or process for completing, compliance checks and other enforcement activities conducted by state and local licensing authorities. As a result, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 5, 2020, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2020, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
