The bill requires that the Department of Labor and Employment include contact information for a designated apprenticeship training program contact for every public high school and school district in the Colorado State Apprenticeship Resource Directory. The bill increases state and local workload beginning in FY 2020-21.

## **Summary of Legislation**

On or before January 1, 2021, the bill requires the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE) to include at least one designated point of contact for apprenticeship training programs from each public high school and every school district in the Colorado State Apprenticeship Resource Directory. CDLE must work with the Department of Education (CDE) to receive and annually update the information.

## **Background**

Senate Bill 19-171 created the Colorado State Apprenticeship Resource Directory (directory). The directory includes detailed information about registered apprentice programs in the state.

#### State Expenditures

The bill increases workload for the CDLE and the CDE to compile and annually update the name and contact information of at least one designated apprenticeship training program contact for every public high school and school district. This workload increase can be accomplished within existing resources.

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## **School District**

The bill may increase workload for school districts to appoint and provide a point of contact for designated apprenticeship training programs if they do not already have an assigned contact.

## **Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 20, 2020, and takes effect September 14, 2020, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
