Summary of Legislation

The bill prevents a common interest community from prohibiting a homeowner from operating a licensed family child care home, unless operating a licensed family child care home contradicts other association regulations such as landscaping or parking.

State Revenue and Expenditures

The Department of Human Services sets an annual application fee to open or continue to operate a licensed family child care home. The fee currently ranges from \$24 to \$39, depending on the type and size of the family child care home, and are credited to the Child Care Licensing Cash Fund. This fee is collected for any new family child care homes opened where they are previously prohibited by association regulations. This revenue, subject to TABOR, is expected to be minimal.

The department publishes rules for licensing and receives applications for licensure. Any increase in workload due to additional application processing is absorbable within current appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 5, 2020, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2020, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
