CONCERNING THE EXTENSION OF THE SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION FOR BEETLE KILL WOOD PRODUCTS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-26-723, **amend** (1) and (3) as follows:

39-26-723. Colorado wood products - repeal. (1) For fiscal years commencing on or after July 1, 2008, but prior to the fiscal year

commencing on July 1, 2020, AND FOR FISCAL YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2021, BUT PRIOR TO THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING ON JULY 1, 2026, all sales, storage, and use of wood from salvaged trees killed or infested in Colorado by mountain pine beetles or spruce beetles, including but not limited to products such as lumber, furniture built from the salvaged trees, and wood chips or wood pellets generated from the salvaged trees, are exempt from taxation under the provisions of parts 1 and 2 of this article ARTICLE 26.

(3) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2021 JULY 1, 2027.
