## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING 2020-21 STATE FISCAL YEAR TRANSFERS FROM THE

102 GENERAL FUND TO SUPPORT OUTDOOR RECREATION, AND, IN

103 CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

In the 2020-21 state fiscal year, the bill transfers \$25 million from the general fund as follows:

• Section 1 transfers \$750,000 to the Colorado avalanche information center fund for use by the Colorado avalanche information center in the department of natural resources

(department) to support backcountry avalanche safety programs;

- Section 2 transfers \$3.5 million to the wildlife cash fund for use by the division of parks and wildlife (division) in the department to implement its statewide wildlife action plan and the conservation of native species;
- Section 3 transfers \$2.25 million to the search and rescue fund for use by the department of local affairs in consultation with the division to support backcountry search and rescue efforts;
- Section 4 transfers \$1 million to the outdoor equity fund for use by the division to implement the outdoor equity grant program; and
- Section 5 transfers \$17.5 million to the parks and outdoor recreation cash fund for use by the division as follows:
  - \$3.5 million for staffing and maintenance projects; and
  - \$14 million for infrastructure and state park development projects.

**Section 6** appropriates the amounts transferred in sections 1 to 5 to the department and the department of local affairs for the uses specified in sections 1 to 5 and authorizes the use of the money through the 2023-24 state fiscal year.

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33-116, add (3)

3 as follows:

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4 24-33-116. Colorado avalanche information center - creation 5 - duties - fund - repeal. (3) (a) WITHIN THREE DAYS AFTER THE 6 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (3), THE STATE TREASURER SHALL 7 TRANSFER SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE 8 GENERAL FUND TO THE FUND FOR USE BY THE COLORADO AVALANCHE 9 INFORMATION CENTER TO SUPPORT BACKCOUNTRY AVALANCHE SAFETY 10 PROGRAMS. 11 (b) THIS SUBSECTION (3) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-1-112, add (1.5)
 as follows:

3 33-1-112. Funds - cost accounting - definition - repeal.
(1.5) (a) WITHIN THREE DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
SUBSECTION (1.5), THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER THREE
MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO
THE WILDLIFE CASH FUND FOR USE BY THE DIVISION TO IMPLEMENT ITS
STATE WILDLIFE ACTION PLAN AND THE CONSERVATION OF NATIVE
SPECIES.

10 (b) This subsection (1.5) is repealed, effective September 1,
2024.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-1-112.5, add (9)
as follows:

14 **33-1-112.5.** Search and rescue fund - repeal. (9) (a) WITHIN 15 THREE DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (9), THE 16 STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED FIFTY 17 THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE SEARCH AND 18 RESCUE FUND FOR USE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS IN 19 CONSULTATION WITH THE DIVISION TO SUPPORT BACKCOUNTRY SEARCH 20 AND RESCUE EFFORTS, INCLUDING TO COVER RESPONSE COSTS, 21 EQUIPMENT, AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES.

(b) THE RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF MONEY SET FORTH IN THIS
section do not apply to the division's use of the money
transferred pursuant to subsection (9)(a) of this section.

25 (c) THIS SUBSECTION (9) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1,
26 2024.

27 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-9-206, as added

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1 **by House Bill 21-1318 add** (4) as follows:

33-9-206. Outdoor equity fund - repeal. (4) (a) WITHIN THREE
DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (4) OR WITHIN
THREE DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SUBSECTIONS (1) TO (3) OF
THIS SECTION, WHICHEVER IS LATER, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
TRANSFER ONE MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE
OUTDOOR EQUITY FUND FOR USE BY THE DIVISION TO IMPLEMENT THE
OUTDOOR EQUITY GRANT PROGRAM.

9 (b) THIS SUBSECTION (4) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1,
10 2024.

SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-10-111, add (1.5)
as follows:

13 33-10-111. Parks and outdoor recreation cash fund - parks for 14 future generations trust fund - creation - fees - accounting 15 expenditures for roads and highways - definition - repeal. 16 (1.5) (a) WITHIN THREE DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS 17 SUBSECTION (1.5), THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER SEVENTEEN 18 MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO 19 THE PARKS AND OUTDOOR RECREATION CASH FUND FOR USE BY THE 20 DIVISION. THE DIVISION SHALL USE:

(I) THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS OF THE
TRANSFERRED MONEY FOR STAFFING AND MAINTENANCE PROJECTS TO
MANAGE INCREASED VISITATION TO STATE PARKS AND THE RESULTANT
IMPACTS ON TRAILS AND OTHER RECREATIONAL AMENITIES; AND

25 (II) FOURTEEN MILLION DOLLARS OF THE TRANSFERRED MONEY
26 FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND STATE PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS,
27 INCLUDING:

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(A) INVESTMENT IN CAMPGROUNDS, TRAILS, ROADS, RESTROOMS,
 AND OTHER FACILITIES;

3 (B) ANY PROJECT PLANNING OR CULTURAL OR NATURAL
4 RESOURCES STUDIES AS NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE PROJECTS; AND
5 (C) ANY NECESSARY EXPENSES TO ALLOW FOR THE USE OF
6 PROPERTIES THAT THE DIVISION HOLDS FOR STATE PARKS PURPOSES.

7 (b) This subsection (1.5) is repealed, effective September 1,
8 2024.

9 **SECTION 6.** Appropriation. (1) (a) For the 2020-21 state fiscal 10 year, \$750,000 is appropriated to the department of natural resources for 11 use by the Colorado avalanche information center (center). This 12 appropriation is from the Colorado avalanche information center fund 13 created in section 24-33-116(2)(c), C.R.S., and is based on an assumption 14 that the center will require an additional 3.0 FTE. To implement this act, 15 the center may use this appropriation for personal services, operating 16 expenses, and other expenses to support backcountry avalanche safety 17 programs.

(b) The money appropriated pursuant to subsection (1)(a) of this
section remains available for the center's use through the 2023-24 state
fiscal year.

(2) (a) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$22,000,000 is
appropriated to the department of natural resources for use by the division
of parks and wildlife (division) as follows:

(I) \$3,500,000 is from the wildlife cash fund created in section
33-1-112 (1)(a), C.R.S., for use by the division to implement its state
wildlife action plan and the conservation of native species;

27 (II) \$1,000,000 is from the outdoor equity fund created in section

33-9-206 (1), C.R.S., for use by the division to implement the outdoor
 equity grant program;

(III) \$3,500,000 is from the parks and outdoor recreation cash
fund created in section 33-10-111 (1), C.R.S., and is based on an
assumption that the division will require an additional 14.0 FTE. To
implement this act, the division may use this appropriation for staffing,
including for personal services and operating expenses, and maintenance
projects to manage increased visitation to state parks and the resultant
impacts on trails and other recreational amenities; and

(IV) \$14,000,000 is from the parks and outdoor recreation cash
fund created in section 33-10-111 (1), C.R.S., for use by the division for
infrastructure and state park development projects, including:

13 (A) Investment in campgrounds, trails, roads, restrooms, and other
14 facilities;

(B) Any project planning or cultural or natural resources studies
as necessary to complete the projects; and

17 (C) Any necessary expenses to allow for the use of properties that18 the division holds for state parks purposes.

(b) The money appropriated pursuant to subsection (2)(a) of this
section remains available for the division's use through the 2023-24 state
fiscal year.

(3) (a) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$2,250,000 is
appropriated to the department of local affairs. This appropriation is from
the search and rescue fund created in section 33-1-112.5 (1), C.R.S. To
implement this act, the department of local affairs in consultation with the
division may use this appropriation to support backcountry search and
rescue efforts, including to cover response costs, equipment, and other

- 1 related expenses.
- (b) The money appropriated pursuant to subsection (3)(a) of this
  section remains available for the department's use through the 2023-24
  state fiscal year.
- 5 SECTION 7. Effective date. This act takes effect upon passage;
  6 except that section 4 of this act takes effect only if House Bill 21-1318
  7 becomes law and takes effect either upon the effective date of this act or
  8 House Bill 21-1318, whichever is later.
- 9 SECTION 8. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
  10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
  11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
