Summary of Legislation

Under current law, architects licensed in Colorado must demonstrate that they retain the material presented in their continuing education program or course. This bill removes that requirement.

State Expenditures

In FY 2021-22, the State Board of Licensure for Architects, Professional Engineers, and Professional Land Surveyors, and the Division of Professions and Occupations in the Department of Regulatory Agencies will conduct rulemaking to remove the requirement that architects demonstrate that they retain the material presented in their continuing education. The division will conduct outreach and education to make licensees aware of the changes and have an ongoing reduction in workload to affirm that licensees have retained the continuing education material prior to renewing their licenses. This does not require a change in appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 29, 2021, and took effect on September 7, 2021.
