The bill requires rulemaking related to entities delivering health care services exclusively or primarily through telemedicine for the state's Medicaid program. This will increase state workload in FY 2022-22.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill directs the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, which administers the state's Medicaid program, to promulgate rules specifically relating to health care providers that deliver health care or mental health services exclusively or primarily through telemedicine.

Background

Under current law, Colorado's Medicaid program covers health care services provided through telemedicine so long as the services meet the same standard of care as an in-person visit and are delivered using HIPAA-compliant technology.

State Expenditures

Workload for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing will increase to promulgate rules. This workload can be incorporated within ongoing work at the department to implement telemedicine in the state; no change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
