CONCERNING THEFT OF PUBLIC BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-4-401, **amend** (1)(d) and (1)(e); and **add** (1)(f) and (12) as follows:

18-4-401. Theft - repeal. (1) A person commits theft when he or she knowingly obtains, retains, or exercises control over anything of value of another without authorization or by threat or deception; receives, loans money by pawn or pledge on, or disposes of anything of value or belonging to another that he or she knows or believes to have been stolen; or procures food or accommodations from a public establishment without making payment therefore, and:

(d) Demands any consideration to which he or she is not legally

entitled as a condition of restoring the thing of value to the other person; or

- (e) Knowingly retains the thing of value more than seventy-two hours after the agreed-upon time of return in any lease or hire agreement; OR
- (f) Intentionally misrepresents or withholds a material fact for determining eligibility for a public benefit and does so for the purpose of obtaining or retaining public benefits for which the person is not eligible.
- (12) A PERSON'S CONDUCT THAT IS LIMITED TO THE ELEMENTS OF SUBSECTION (1)(f) OF THIS SECTION IS NOT SUBJECT TO PROSECUTION PURSUANT TO ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION.
- **SECTION 2.** Effective date applicability. This act takes effect July 1, 2022, and applies to offenses committed on or after said date.
 - **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
