Sunset Bill. This bill continues the School Safety Resource Center Advisory in the Department of Public Safety, which is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2022. State fiscal impacts under the bill include only the continuation of the program's current expenditures. The program is continued indefinitely.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill continues the School Safety Resource Center Advisory Board in the Department of Public Safety (DPS) indefinitely. The board is currently scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2022.

Continuing Program Impacts

Based on the 2021 sunset report, the DPS is expected to have minimal expenditures to reimburse members to travel to meetings. If this bill is enacted, current minimal expenditures will continue for the program starting in FY 2022-23. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 12, 2022, and takes effect on August 9, 2022, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
