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# A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING ADDING AGGRAVATED MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT TO THE LIST OF CONVICTIONS THAT APPLY TO THE OFFENSE OF POSSESSION OF WEAPONS BY PREVIOUS OFFENDERS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

## **Bill Summary**

Under current law, it is illegal for someone to possess a firearm if the person was convicted of or adjudicated for certain felonies. The bill adds aggravated motor vehicle theft to the convictions that prohibit a

6	(1), a felony conviction or adjudication for one of the following felonies

13	SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2023-24 state fiscal year,
14	\$48,217 is appropriated to the judicial department for use by probation
15	and related services. This appropriation is from the general fund and is
16	based on an assumption that the department will require an additional 0.6
17	FTE. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation
18	for probation programs.
19	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
20	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
