Bill Summary

Under current law, it is illegal for someone to possess a firearm if the person was convicted of or adjudicated for certain felonies. The bill adds aggravated motor vehicle theft to the convictions that prohibit a SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended March 15, 2023

18	SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2023-24 state fiscal year,
