#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING MODIFICATION OF THE PROHIBITION ON COUNTY EMPLOYEE ACQUISITION OF TAX LIENS.

### **Bill Summary**

Current law prohibits a county employee from purchasing a tax lien or property for which a tax lien is sold. The bill narrows the prohibition to apply to a county employee only if the employee participates in the tax lien sales process by preparing, conducting, or executing a sale of lands and town lots.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-11-151, amend 3 (1) as follows: 4 39-11-151. County officials and employees may not acquire a 5 tax lien or property by sale of a tax lien. (1) (a) No property for which 6 a tax lien is sold for delinquent taxes under this article shall be conveyed 7 to an elected or appointed county official, to a county employee WHO PREPARES, CONDUCTS, OR EXECUTES A SALE OF LANDS AND TOWN LOTS 8 9 UNDER THIS ARTICLE 11, or to a member of the immediate family of any 10 such person or to the agent of any such county official or employee, if the 11 tax lien on such property is sold during the time the official or employee 12 holds office or is employed. 13 (b) No tax lien shall be sold to an elected or appointed county 14 official, to a county employee WHO PREPARES, CONDUCTS, OR EXECUTES 15 A SALE OF LANDS AND TOWN LOTS UNDER THIS ARTICLE 11, or to a 16 member of the immediate family of such person or to the agent of any 17 such county official or employee during the time the official or employee 18 holds office or is employed. 19 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 20 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 21 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 22 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 23 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 24 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 25 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

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- November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 2 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
