CONCERNING UPDATES REGARDING PRADER-WILLI SYNDROME.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-6-402, **amend** (4)(d); and **repeal** (4)(a) and (4)(e) as follows:

- 25.5-6-402. Legislative declaration Prader-Willi syndrome. (4) The general assembly further finds and declares that:
- (a) Prader-Willi syndrome is a genetic condition that occurs in approximately one in fifteen to twenty-five thousand people worldwide, and

there are up to three hundred seventy-five individuals living with this syndrome in Colorado;

- (d) The most critical hallmark of Prader-Willi syndrome is overeating. Individuals with Prader-Willi syndrome cannot tell when they are full and will continue to eat without stop STOPPING, leading to A ruptured stomachs STOMACH and even death. Other symptoms include significant developmental and cognitive delays, skin picking, sleep problems, obsessive-compulsive behaviors, hypothyroidism, hypogonadism, and low muscle tone.
- (e) The state of Colorado does not currently recognize Prader-Willi syndrome as an intellectual and developmental disability.
