3 (1) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$13,975,326 is appropriated to the
4 department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of
5 overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of
6 section 2 of chapter 504 (SB 21-205), Session Laws of Colorado 2021,
7 as follows:

8 (a) \$9,975,719 from the general fund for medical and long-term
9 care services for Medicaid eligible individuals;

10 (b) \$3,760,865 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability
11 fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for
12 behavioral health capitation payments;

13 (c) \$2,393 from the breast and cervical cancer prevention and
14 treatment fund created in Section 25.5-5-308 (8)(a)(I), C.R.S., for
15 behavioral health capitation payments;

16 (d) \$10,549 from the general fund for behavioral health
17 fee-for-service payments; and

18 (e) \$225,800 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability
19 fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for
20 behavioral health fee-for-service payments.

21 (2) In accordance with section 24-75-109 (4)(a), C.R.S., all
22 restrictions on funds for the department of health care policy and
23 financing for the 2022-23 state fiscal year for the amounts and items of
24 appropriation listed in this section are released.

25 **SECTION 3. Appropriation to the department of health care**
26 **policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.** In
27 Session Laws of Colorado 2022, **amend** section 137 (7)(c) and (7)(d) of

1 chapter 123, (HB 22-1295), as follows:

2 Section 137. **Appropriation - adjustments to 2022 long bill.**

3 (7)(c) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, ~~\$4,063,691~~ \$3,685,974 is
4 appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing for use
5 by the executive director's office, transfers to/from other departments.
6 This appropriation is from the general fund, which is subject to the "(M)"
7 notation as defined in the annual general appropriation act for the same
8 fiscal year. To implement this act, the department may use this
9 appropriation for transfer to the department of early childhood for early
10 intervention services.

11 (d) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, the general assembly
12 anticipates that the department of health care policy and financing will
13 receive ~~\$4,063,691~~ \$4,672,244 in federal funds for transfer to the
14 department of early childhood for early intervention services to
15 implement this act. The appropriation in subsection (7)(c) of this section
16 is based on the assumption that the department will receive this amount
17 of federal funds.

18 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
19 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
