## A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE OPERATION OF AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING

102 SYSTEMS.

#### **Bill Summary**

The bill authorizes a prescription drug outlet to operate an automated pharmacy dispensing system for the purpose of dispensing prescription medications, other than controlled substances, to patients.

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-126, add
2	(1)(u) as follows:
3	12-280-126. Unprofessional conduct - grounds for discipline.
4	(1) The board may take disciplinary or other action as authorized in
5	section 12-20-404, after a hearing held in accordance with the provisions
6	of sections 12-20-403 and 12-280-127, upon proof that the licensee,
7	certificant, or registrant:
8	(u) HAS OPERATED AN AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING
9	SYSTEM OR OTHERWISE DISPENSED A DRUG FROM SUCH SYSTEM UNLESS
10	THE SYSTEM HAS BEEN REGISTERED WITH THE BOARD BY THE OPERATING
11	PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET.
12	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-280-141 as
13	follows:
14	12-280-141. Prescription drugs - automated pharmacy
15	dispensing system - rules - definition. (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION,
16	"AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM" OR "SYSTEM" MEANS A
17	MECHANICAL SYSTEM THAT DISPENSES PRESCRIPTION DRUGS TO A PERSON
18	INTERACTING WITH A REMOTE PHARMACIST AND MAINTAINS RELATED
19	TRANSACTION INFORMATION.
20	(2) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET MAY DISPENSE PRESCRIPTION
21	DRUGS THROUGH AN AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM IN
22	ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION AND RULES PROMULGATED BY THE
23	BOARD. A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET THAT OPERATES AN AUTOMATED
24	PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPENSING SYSTEM IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
25	SECURITY, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SYSTEM AND SHALL
26	ENSURE THAT THERE IS A PHARMACIST ACTING ON BEHALF OF THE
27	PRESCRIPTION DRIGOLITEET PROVIDING SERVICES TO PATIENTS ACCESSING

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1	PRESCRIPTION DRUGS THROUGH THE SYSTEM. THE PHARMACIST MAY
2	SUPERVISE THE SYSTEM THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS AND IS NOT
3	REQUIRED TO BE PHYSICALLY PRESENT AT THE SITE WHERE THE SYSTEM IS
4	LOCATED.
5	(3) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET THAT DISPENSES PRESCRIPTION
6	DRUGS THROUGH AN AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM SHALL:
7	(a) REGISTER THE SYSTEM WITH THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH
8	RULES PROMULGATED BY THE BOARD.
9	(b) REQUIRE A PHARMACIST TO PERFORM ALL CLINICAL SERVICES
10	CONDUCTED AS PART OF THE DISPENSING PROCESS, INCLUDING DRUG
11	UTILIZATION REVIEW AND CONSULTATION SERVICES;
12	
13	(c) Ensure that each system clearly displays the
14	ASSOCIATED PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET REGISTRATION NUMBER AND
15	CLEAR CONTACT INFORMATION FOR PERSONS USING THE SYSTEM TO
16	CONTACT THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET;
17	(d) Locate each system that dispenses controlled
18	SUBSTANCES AT THE SAME LOCATION AS A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET
19	REGISTERED BY THE UNITED STATES DRUG ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.
20	(e) MAINTAIN A RECORD OF EACH PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPENSED
21	FROM THE AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM, INCLUDING THE
22	IDENTITY OF THE PHARMACIST RESPONSIBLE FOR VERIFYING THE
23	ACCURACY OF THE DOSAGE OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPENSED, THE
24	DIRECTIONS FOR USE OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG, AND THE COUNSELING
25	SERVICES, IF ANY, PROVIDED TO THE INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE
26	PRESCRIPTION DRUG IS DISPENSED;
27	(f) ENSUDE THAT CONFIDENTIALITY OF DEDSONAL HEALTH

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1	INFORMATION IS MAINTAINED; AND
2	(g) Ensure that the system is accessible to persons with
3	DISABILITIES IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FEDERAL
4	"AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990", 42 U.S.C. SEC. 12101 ET
5	SEQ., AS AMENDED.
6	(4) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET MAY OPERATE AN AUTOMATED
7	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM IN THE SAME OR IN A DIFFERENT
8	LOCATION THAN THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET. THE AUTOMATED
9	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM MUST BE:
10	(a) Under the supervision and control of the prescription
11	DRUG OUTLET;
12	(b) INSTALLED IN A PLACE AND IN A MANNER TO ENSURE THAT A
13	PERSON IS UNABLE TO REMOVE THE SYSTEM FROM ITS LOCATION AND ANY
14	ATTEMPTS TO OBTAIN ACCESS TO THE SYSTEM WITHOUT AUTHORIZATION
15	ARE VISIBLE TO THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET PHARMACIST, EITHER
16	THROUGH THE DIRECT VIEW OF THE PHARMACIST OR BY REAL-TIME
17	AUDIO-VISUAL COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY OR AUDIO-VISUAL
18	RECORDING TECHNOLOGY; AND
19	(c) LOCATED IN A SECURE LOCATION IN:
20	(I) THE REGISTERED ADDRESS OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET
21	(II) THE MEDICAL FACILITY; OR
22	(III) THE PRACTICE LOCATION OF ONE OR MORE PRACTITIONERS.
23	(5) AN AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM MAY ONLY
24	DISPENSE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS UPON THE AUTHORIZATION OF A
25	PHARMACIST ACTING ON BEHALF OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET
26	AFTER THE PHARMACIST HAS REVIEWED THE PRESCRIPTION ORDER AND
2.7	THE PATIENT'S PROFILE FOR POTENTIAL CONTRAINDICATIONS AND

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1	ADVERSE DRUG REACTIONS.
2	(6) (a) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET OPERATING AN AUTOMATED
3	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM SHALL DEVELOP, IMPLEMENT, AND
4	MAINTAIN WRITTEN POLICIES AND PROCEDURES TO ENSURE THE PROPER,
5	SAFE, AND SECURE FUNCTIONING OF THE SYSTEM. THE POLICIES AND
6	PROCEDURES MUST, AT A MINIMUM, ADDRESS:
7	(I) MAINTAINING THE SECURITY OF THE AUTOMATED PHARMACY
8	DISPENSING SYSTEM AND ANY ACCOMPANYING ELECTRONIC VERIFICATION
9	PROCESS AND ENSURING THE SYSTEM AND ACCOMPANYING ELECTRONIC
10	VERIFICATION PROCESS ARE IN GOOD WORKING ORDER;
11	(II) Ensuring the accurate filling, stocking, restocking,
12	AND FINAL VERIFICATION OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS DISPENSED FROM THE
13	SYSTEM;
14	(III) Ensuring the sanitary operation of the system and
15	THE PREVENTION OF CROSS-CONTAMINATION OF CELLS, CARTRIDGES,
16	CONTAINERS, CASSETTES, AND PACKAGES;
17	(IV) TRAINING OF INDIVIDUALS AUTHORIZED TO ACCESS, STOCK,
18	RESTOCK, AND USE THE SYSTEM;
19	(V) CONDUCTING ROUTINE AND PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE OF
20	THE SYSTEM, INCLUDING CALIBRATION OF THE SYSTEM, IF APPLICABLE;
21	(VI) REMOVING EXPIRED, ADULTERATED, MISBRANDED, OR
22	RECALLED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS FROM THE SYSTEM;
23	(VII) Ensuring that prescription drugs are stored under
24	APPROPRIATE CONDITIONS AND TEMPERATURES;
25	(VIII) PREVENTING UNAUTHORIZED INDIVIDUALS FROM ACCESSING
26	THE SYSTEM, INCLUDING ASSIGNING, DISCONTINUING, OR MODIFYING
27	SECURITY ACCESS TO THE SYSTEM;

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1	(IA) IDENTIFYING AND RECORDING THE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE
2	RESPONSIBLE FOR FILLING, STOCKING, AND RESTOCKING THE SYSTEM; AND
3	(X) Ensuring compliance with state and federal laws,
4	INCLUDING ALL APPLICABLE LABELING, STORAGE, AND SECURITY
5	REQUIREMENTS.
6	(b) THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET SHALL ANNUALLY REVIEW
7	THE WRITTEN POLICIES AND PROCEDURES REQUIRED PURSUANT TO THIS
8	SUBSECTION (6). THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET SHALL DOCUMENT ITS
9	ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES, MAINTAIN THE
10	RECORD OF EACH REVIEW FOR AT LEAST TWO YEARS, AND MAKE THE
11	REVIEW RECORDS AVAILABLE TO THE BOARD UPON REQUEST.
12	(c) THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET OPERATING AN AUTOMATED
13	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM SHALL COLLECT, CONTROL, AND
14	MAINTAIN ALL TRANSACTION INFORMATION TO ACCURATELY TRACK THE
15	MOVEMENT OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS INTO AND OUT OF THE SYSTEM TO
16	ENSURE PROPER SECURITY, ACCURACY, AND ACCOUNTABILITY.
17	(7) THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET OPERATING THE AUTOMATED
18	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OPERATION,
19	MAINTENANCE, AND SECURITY OF THE SYSTEM AND SHALL LABEL
20	PRESCRIPTION DRUGS DISPENSED FROM THE SYSTEM IN ACCORDANCE WITH
21	EXISTING LAW THAT RECORDS EACH TRANSACTION MADE THROUGH THE
22	SYSTEM.
23	(8) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET THAT OPERATES INSIDE THE
24	PREMISES OF A RETAIL BUSINESS SHALL ONLY OPERATE AN AUTOMATED
25	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM DURING THE HOURS THAT THE
26	PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET IS CLOSED.
2.7	(9) ALL PRESCRIPTION DRUGS STORED IN AN AUTOMATED

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1	PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM ARE PART OF THE INVENTORY OF THE
2	PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET OPERATING THE SYSTEM, AND ALL
3	PRESCRIPTION DRUGS DISPENSED FROM THE SYSTEM ARE CONSIDERED TO
4	HAVE BEEN DISPENSED BY THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET THAT
5	OPERATES THE SYSTEM.
6	(10) The prescription drug outlet shall make all
7	TRANSACTION INFORMATION CONCERNING EACH SYSTEM UNDER ITS
8	OPERATION READILY AVAILABLE IN A DOWNLOADABLE FORMAT FOR
9	REVIEW AND INSPECTION BY THE BOARD. A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET
10	SHALL MAINTAIN THE RECORDS FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME DETERMINED BY
11	RULE OF THE BOARD.
12	(11) THE BOARD MAY PROMULGATE RULES AS NECESSARY TO
13	IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
14	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
15	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
16	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
17	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
18	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
19	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
20	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
21	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
22	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
