### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING MEASURES TO SUPPORT THE IN-DEMAND CAREER
102	WORKFORCE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN
103	APPROPRIATION.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill directs the state board of community colleges and occupational education (board) to administer the in-demand short-term credentials program (program) in order to support the expansion of the number of available and qualified professionals who are able to meet Colorado's in-demand workforce needs.

The bill appropriates \$38.6 million from the general fund for this program. The board is required to allocate funds to community and technical colleges, area technical colleges, local district colleges, and Colorado Mesa university to provide assistance to students for eligible expenses that support their enrollment in eligible programs. If unexpended resources exist, the funds must be used to pay for a student's housing, transportation, or food expenses.

The bill requires the office of future work to provide grants to registered apprenticeship programs that provide training in the building and construction trade at no cost to apprentices. The bill appropriates \$1.4 million from the general fund for this grant program.

The bill appropriates \$5 million from the general fund to create 2 new short-term degree nursing programs at community or technical colleges.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

- (a) Colorado has significant workforce demands in various industries, including early childhood education, education, law enforcement, fire and forestry, construction, and nursing;
- (b) These industries support other industries across the economy and have a positive return on public investment because: All Coloradans benefit from the availability of child care and education so that they may work while knowing their children are safe and cared for; that the foundational infrastructure is secure through high-quality construction; that fundamental public services are provided through fire protection, forest management, and law enforcement; and that people have access to quality health care;
- (c) According to labor market index data, Colorado has an opportunity to scale these industries because demand for these industries is projected to grow based on recent patterns suggesting an average of ten

1	to fifteen percent annual increase in these industry jobs;
2	(d) These in-demand industries have significant job openings:
3	(I) The education sector consistently has approximately five
4	thousand job openings, which openings have been exacerbated by
5	professionals leaving the sector because of industry pressures and the
6	COVID-19 pandemic;
7	(II) The nursing sector consistently has approximately twenty
8	thousand job openings;
9	(III) Job openings in the construction sector are anticipated to
10	double because of the historic federal investment in infrastructure and
11	electrification; and
12	(IV) The early childhood sector, the fire and forestry sector, and
13	the law enforcement sector each have approximately one thousand job
14	openings;
15	(e) Investment in postsecondary education and training that leads
16	to careers in these industries demonstrates to Coloradans that these
17	professions are a priority for the state and that supporting enrollment in
18	educational and training programs will ensure a qualified workforce with
19	limited debt and a clear path to employment;
20	(f) The state's investment in the in-demand short-term credentials
21	program is intended to support twenty thousand students pursuing
22	credentials in these industries; and
23	(g) The extraordinary demand for short-term education and
24	training in nursing exceeds the state's current capacity to meet the
25	demand. The state's investment in increasing the capacity is intended to
26	support the training of two hundred additional nurses annually.
