	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING METHANE SEEPAGE IN THE RATON BASIN OF COLORADO,
102	AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REQUIRING THE COLORADO
103	OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO COMPLETE A
104	STUDY AND ESTABLISH A NEW REGULATORY CATEGORY AND
105	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the Colorado oil and gas conservation commission (commission), in consultation with local governments, to

perform a study that:

- Recognizes best management practices for capturing methane seepage in the Raton basin;
- Confirms the high quality of water resulting from such methane capture operations; and
- Confirms the high potential to preserve and make beneficial use of such water.

The commission must complete the study and submit it to legislative committees of reference by December 1, 2023.

The bill also requires the commission to implement a regulatory category for methane recovery in the Raton basin, which category includes consideration of enforcement, financial assurance, flow lines, forms, operator guidance, orphan well programs, rules, and policies and allows for beneficial uses deemed prudent by local governments.

25	section 34-60-122 (5), C.R.S. To implement this act, the commission may
26	use this appropriation for program costs.
27	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

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takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
