A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A REQUIRED NOTICE OF LIMITED TRANSFERABILITY OF 102 COLLEGE CREDITS FROM A PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires a private occupational school to provide a notice with the copy of the executed enrollment contract that explains that credits from the school do not transfer to an institution of higher education that has regional accreditation.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-64-112, amend
3	(1)(m) as follows:
4	23-64-112. Minimum standards. (1) In establishing the criteria
5	required by section 23-64-108 (1)(a), (1)(b), and (1)(j), the board shall
6	observe and require compliance with at least the following minimum
7	standards for all schools:
8	(m) That the school provides the student with a copy of the
9	executed enrollment agreement or contract, at the time of enrollment, that
10	complies with this article 64 AND INCLUDES A NOTICE OUTLINING THE
11	FOLLOWING INFORMATION REGARDING LIMITED CREDIT TRANSFERABILITY:
12	(I) CREDITS OBTAINED AT THE SCHOOL WILL NOT TRANSFER TO
13	STATE UNIVERSITIES, COLLEGES, COMMUNITY COLLEGES, OR PRIVATE,
14	NON-PROFIT UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES THAT HAVE REGIONAL
15	ACCREDITATION SUPPORTED BY THE STATE OF COLORADO; AND
16	(II) STUDENTS ARE ADVISED TO CHECK WHETHER OR NOT ANY
17	INSTITUTION IN COLORADO OR IN ANOTHER STATE TO WHICH THE STUDENT
18	MAY TRANSFER CREDITS WILL ACCEPT CREDITS OR DEGREES FROM THE
19	NON-REGIONALLY ACCREDITED SCHOOL.
20	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
21	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
22	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
23	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
24	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
25	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
26	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

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- November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 2 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
