# **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) is developing a budget package for FY 2023-24. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$13,879 for FY 2023-24, reducing the General Fund available for other FY 2023-24 appropriations by this amount.
