Fiscal Note Status:	The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Energy and Environment Committee on February 23, 2023; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.		

Summary of Legislation

Current law requires counties and municipalities to adopt certain energy efficiency standards when updating building codes. The bill delays the timeline by which rural counties and municipalities must comply with these requirements. Rural counties are defined as those with a population under 30,000 people, and the bill defines rural municipalities as those with a population under 10,000 people.

Current law allows rural counties to retain lower standards if they do not receive a grant from the Colorado Energy Office that significantly assists in energy code adoption and enforcement training. The bill establishes a similar provision for rural municipalities.

State Expenditures

By extending the deadline to adopt certain energy code requirements, the bill may delay some disbursements of grant funding from the Colorado Energy Office to rural counties and municipalities. The fiscal note assumes that no additional grant funding will become available because of this bill and that only the timing of state expenditures may be impacted.

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Local Government

The bill decreases expenditures of rural counties and municipalities. Rural local governments that delay the adoption of stricter energy code requirements into their building codes will have decreased expenditures for subsequent renovations of public buildings and for building code enforcement. These savings may be partially offset by increased energy costs.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
