Bill Topic: SPECIES CONSERVATION TRUST FUND PROJECTS

The bill authorizes expenditures in the Department of Natural Resources for a designated list of projects to conserve native species. It increases state expenditures beginning in FY 2023-24.

Appropriation Summary: For FY 2023-24, the enacted bill authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to spend \$5.0 million. See State Appropriations section.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

## Summary of Legislation

The bill authorizes the use of \$5 million from the Species Conservation Trust Fund (SCTF) for specific programs submitted by the director of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The programs are designed to conserve native species that are threatened or endangered under state or federal law, or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The funds authorized are available in FY 2023-24, and remain available for the designated purposes until they are fully spent.

## State Expenditures

For FY 2023-24, the bill authorizes expenditures of \$5 million from the SCTF for the projects summarized in Table 2.
