The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$1,000,000 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2023-24. The provision also appropriates a total of \$67,627 cash funds to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2023-24, and reappropriates \$23,263 to the Department of Law for FY 2023-24. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Regulatory Agencies will require an additional 0.5 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.1 FTE.
