## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill requires the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ) within the Department of Public Safety to submit a progress report to the General Assembly on its study of sentencing reform on January 31, 2024, and January 31, 2025.

### **State Expenditures**

CCJJ workload will increase to provide a sentencing reform study progress report. Because the CCJJ is currently working on this study, a progress report requires no change in appropriations.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
