Bill Topic: INFORMATION TECH PROJECT APPROPRIATION PROCESS

The bill modifies how certain information technology projects are funded and evaluated. It increases state workload beginning in FY 2022-23.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Current law allows the Joint Budget Committee to submit operating budget requests for information technology to the Joint Technology Committee for review. The bill expands this oversight to include requests from the Legislative Department, the Department of Law, the Department of State, and the Department of the Treasury, and allows any such information technology projects to be funded from the Information Technology Capital Account in the Capital Construction Fund.

State Expenditures

The bill increases workload in the Legislative Department for the Joint Technology Committee to review additional projects. While this workload will vary from year to year based on the number of requests received, the fiscal note assumes that the average number of additional projects will be small and no change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on March 3, 2023.
