### **Summary of Legislation**

Currently, local governments are prohibited from providing cable television, telecommunications, or advanced services, defined as high speed internet of certain speeds, unless voters approve the provision of these services. The bill removes this voter approval requirement, allowing local governments to provide these services or enter into public-private partnerships with service providers without holding an election first.

In addition to communication services, the bill specifies that local governments can provide middle mile infrastructure, which is broadband infrastructure that does not connect to an end-user location. The bill also clarifies language in current laws by replacing the term "advanced service" with "broadband internet service."

### **Local Government Impact**

Local governments that choose to be providers of communication services will no longer have costs to seek voter approval. To the extent that more local governments pursue these types of projects, costs will increase accordingly, as well as revenue for services that charge a fee to users. The bill may also increase local government access to grant funding, which will increase revenue and expenditures for local governments that apply for and receive grants.

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#### **Effective Date**

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on May 1, 2023.
