### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill creates the Colorado Universal Preschool Program Provider Participation Bonus Program within the Department of Early Childhood (CDEC). The program provides a one-time bonus payment to preschool providers that are participating in the Colorado Universal Preschool program and have not previously participated in the Colorado state-run preschool program. Providers may receive an additional bonus payment if they maintain or increase their capacity to serve infants and toddlers between April 1, 2022 and April 1, 2024, or are in low-capacity preschool areas. The bonus must be used to implement the preschool program or maintain or expand infant and toddler care.

The bill requires CDEC to establish the rules and processes for the program and, by September 1, 2023, must determine the number and amount of bonus payments to be distributed. Payments must be distributed to recipients by June 30, 2024, and CDEC must report on the program to the Joint Budget Committee by September 1, 2024.

The program repeals on July 1, 2025.

#### **State Expenditures**

The fiscal note assumes that \$2.5 million will be made available to CDEC to fund the program in FY 2023-24. A portion of this will be used to make IT system modifications to allow for managing of the program, estimated at \$126,000 or 5 percent of the total appropriation. CDEC will also have workload to establish rules, process applications, distribute bonus payments, and monitor and report on the program.

After administrative costs, the remaining \$2.4 million will be allocated as bonus payments to eligible recipients, with the number and amount of bonus payments to be determined by the CDEC based on the number of eligible providers registered. Funding for the bonus payments is at the discretion of the General Assembly. The fiscal note will be updated if more information on program funding levels become available.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

## **State Appropriations**

For FY 2023-24, the bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$2,500,000 to the Department of Early Childhood.
