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**Bill Topic: ALLOCATION FOR ART IN PUBLIC PLACES FOR 2022-23 FY** 

Summary of Fiscal Impact: No fiscal impact. The bill clarifies requirements for the Art in Public Places program and makes it optional for certain projects. It is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Bill Status:

**Fiscal Note** Status:

### **Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, certain capital construction projects must use an amount up to one percent of the state-funded portion of construction costs to acquire art as part of the Art in Public Places Program. The bill clarifies that appropriations from the Revenue Loss Restoration Cash Fund constitute state funds for the program's requirements. It also makes the Art in Public Places program optional for appropriations made for FY 2022-23, and allows state agencies and state institutions of higher education to use funds that would otherwise be used for art for other costs associated with the project.

## Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill gives state agencies and state institutions of higher education flexibility in how to use existing appropriations, but it does not change the amount of any appropriation or the scope of any project. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

#### **Effective Date**

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 6, 2023.
