Bill Summary

The bill allows a health-care provider and a health facility to provide a patient with certain topical medications for the patient's continuity of treatment after discharge from or leaving the health facility, if the medications were used at the health facility by the patient for a surgical procedure or for a visit to a physician's office or medical practice.

12-30-123. Health-care providers - on-site administered
topical medication - use for continued treatment - definition. (1) As
USED IN THIS SECTION, "FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION" OR
"MEDICATION" MEANS A TOPICAL MEDICATION THAT A HEALTH-CARE
PROVIDER OR MEDICAL OFFICE HAS ON HAND OR THAT IS RETRIEVED FROM
A DISPENSING SYSTEM FOR A SPECIFIED PATIENT FOR USE DURING A
SURGICAL PROCEDURE OR A VISIT TO A HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER.

PATIENT AT THE TIME OF DISCHARGE FROM THE FACILITY; OR

(II) IF THE FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION'S CONTAINER
INCLUDES ONLY THE NAME AND STRENGTH OF THE MEDICATION, INCLUDE
THE FACILITY NAME, THE PRESCRIBING HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER'S NAME,
THE PATIENT'S NAME, AND THE DIRECTIONS FOR USE WITH EDUCATION
MATERIALS PROVIDED TO THE PATIENT AT THE TIME OF DISCHARGE FROM
THE FACILITY.

13 (3) IF A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS USED FOR A PATIENT 14 IN AN OPERATING ROOM OR EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT SETTING OR FOR A 15 VISIT TO A HEALTH FACILITY AND THE FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS 16 PROVIDED TO THE PATIENT FOR CONTINUITY OF TREATMENT, THE HEALTH FACILITY OR HOSPITAL PHARMACY, WHICHEVER PROVIDES THE 17 18 MEDICATION, IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COUNSELING THE PATIENT ON THE 19 PROPER USE OF THE MEDICATION, AND A PHARMACIST'S REQUIREMENT TO 20 COUNSEL THE PATIENT CONCERNING THE MEDICATION PURSUANT TO 21 SECTION 12-280-138 IS WAIVED.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.
