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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF A FACILITY-PROVIDED TOPICAL
102 MEDICATION TO A PATIENT FOR THE CONTINUITY OF THE
103 PATIENT'S TREATMENT AFTER A SURGICAL PROCEDURE.

#### **Bill Summary**

The bill allows a health-care provider and a health facility to provide a patient with certain topical medications for the patient's continuity of treatment after discharge from or leaving the health facility, if the medications were used at the health facility by the patient for a surgical procedure or for a visit to a physician's office or medical practice.







1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-30-123 as
3 follows:

12-30-123. Health-care providers - on-site administered
topical medication - use for continued treatment - definition. (1) As
USED IN THIS SECTION, "FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION" OR
"MEDICATION" MEANS A TOPICAL MEDICATION THAT A HEALTH-CARE
PROVIDER OR MEDICAL OFFICE HAS ON HAND OR THAT IS RETRIEVED FROM
A DISPENSING SYSTEM FOR A SPECIFIED PATIENT FOR USE DURING A
SURGICAL PROCEDURE OR A VISIT TO A HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER.

11 (2) (a) A HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER MAY OFFER ANY UNUSED 12 PORTION OF A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION TO A PATIENT IF THE 13 MEDICATION IS REQUIRED FOR CONTINUED TREATMENT, THE MEDICATION 14 DOES NOT CONTAIN A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, AND THE MEDICATION 15 WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE PATIENT DURING THE PATIENT'S VISIT TO THE 16 HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER. THE HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER SHALL DOCUMENT 17 WITHIN THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD THAT THE PATIENT MUST 18 CONTINUE THE MEDICATION AT HOME, INCLUDING THE PATIENT'S DOSAGE 19 AND DIRECTIONS FOR USE.

(b) A HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER SHALL LABEL A FACILITY-PROVIDED
MEDICATION AS REQUIRED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 280 OF THIS TITLE 12.
(3) IF A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS USED FOR A PATIENT
DURING A VISIT TO A HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER AND THE
FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS PROVIDED TO THE PATIENT FOR
CONTINUITY OF TREATMENT, THE HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER IS RESPONSIBLE
FOR COUNSELING THE PATIENT ON THE PROPER USE OF THE MEDICATION,

AND A PHARMACIST'S REQUIREMENT TO COUNSEL THE PATIENT
 CONCERNING THE MEDICATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-280-138 IS
 WAIVED.

4 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-1-138 as
5 follows:

6 25-1-138. Health facilities - on-site administered topical
7 medication - use for continued treatment - definitions. (1) AS USED IN
8 THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

9 (a) "FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION" OR "MEDICATION" MEANS
10 <u>A TOPICAL MEDICATION THAT A HEALTH FACILITY HAS ON HAND OR IS</u>
11 RETRIEVED FROM A DISPENSING SYSTEM FOR A SPECIFIED PATIENT FOR USE
12 DURING A SURGICAL PROCEDURE OR A VISIT TO A HEALTH FACILITY.

(b) "HEALTH FACILITY" MEANS A HOSPITAL LICENSED PURSUANT
TO SECTION 25-1.5-103 AND AN AMBULATORY SURGICAL CENTER
LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 3 OF THIS TITLE 25.

16 (2) (a) A HEALTH FACILITY OR HOSPITAL PHARMACY MAY OFFER 17 ANY UNUSED PORTION OF A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION TO A 18 PATIENT UPON THE PATIENT'S DISCHARGE FROM THE HEALTH FACILITY IF 19 THE MEDICATION IS REQUIRED FOR CONTINUED TREATMENT, THE MEDICATION DOES NOT CONTAIN A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, AND THE \_\_\_\_ 20 21 MEDICATION WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE PATIENT DURING THE PATIENT'S 22 VISIT TO THE HEALTH FACILITY. <u>A</u> HEALTH FACILITY <u>SHALL DOCUMENT</u> 23 WITHIN THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD THAT THE PATIENT MUST 24 CONTINUE THE MEDICATION AT HOME, INCLUDING THE PATIENT'S DOSAGE 25 AND DIRECTIONS FOR USE.

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27 (b) A HEALTH FACILITY OR HOSPITAL PHARMACY SHALL:

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1 (I) LABEL A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION WITH, AT A 2 MINIMUM, THE FACILITY NAME, THE PRESCRIBING HEALTH-CARE 3 PROVIDER'S NAME, THE PATIENT'S NAME, THE DRUG IDENTIFICATION, AND 4 THE DIRECTIONS FOR USE IF THE INSTRUCTIONS ARE NOT PROVIDED TO THE 5 PATIENT AT THE TIME OF DISCHARGE FROM THE FACILITY; OR

6 (II) IF THE FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION'S CONTAINER
7 INCLUDES ONLY THE NAME AND STRENGTH OF THE MEDICATION, INCLUDE
8 THE FACILITY NAME, THE PRESCRIBING HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER'S NAME,
9 THE PATIENT'S NAME, AND THE DIRECTIONS FOR USE WITH EDUCATION
10 MATERIALS PROVIDED TO THE PATIENT AT THE TIME OF DISCHARGE FROM
11 THE FACILITY.

12 (3) IF A FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS USED FOR A PATIENT 13 IN AN OPERATING ROOM OR EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT SETTING OR FOR A 14 VISIT TO A HEALTH FACILITY AND THE FACILITY-PROVIDED MEDICATION IS 15 PROVIDED TO THE PATIENT FOR CONTINUITY OF TREATMENT, THE HEALTH 16 FACILITY OR HOSPITAL PHARMACY, WHICHEVER PROVIDES THE 17 MEDICATION, IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COUNSELING THE PATIENT ON THE 18 PROPER USE OF THE MEDICATION, AND A PHARMACIST'S REQUIREMENT TO 19 COUNSEL THE PATIENT CONCERNING THE MEDICATION PURSUANT TO 20 SECTION 12-280-138 IS WAIVED.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.
