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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING ASSISTANCE FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES TO APPLY FOR**  
102 **WILDFIRE-RELATED GRANT MONEY.**

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**Bill Summary**

**Wildfire Matters Review Committee.** The bill directs the rural opportunity office (office) in the Colorado office of economic development to assist rural communities with identifying and applying for state or federal grants for wildfire mitigation, prevention, response, or risk management efforts (wildfire-related grants).

On or before July 1, 2025, and on or before July 1 of every odd

year thereafter, the office is required to prepare a report summarizing its work to assist rural communities with identifying and applying for wildfire-related grants. The report must include information about the rural communities that the office assists and the grants awarded to rural communities that the office assists. The office is required to submit the report to the wildfire matters review committee or, if the committee no longer exists, to the legislative committees with jurisdiction over natural resources matters.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 23-31-321 as  
3 follows:

4 **23-31-321. Wildfire mitigation and preparedness - rural grant**  
5 **navigator grant program - creation - administration - reporting -**  
6 **definitions.** (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT  
7 OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

8 (a) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS  
9 CREATED IN SECTION 24-1-125.

10 (b) "FOREST SERVICE" MEANS THE COLORADO STATE FOREST  
11 SERVICE IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 23-31-302.

12 (c) "NONGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION" OR "NGO" HAS THE  
13 MEANING SET FORTH IN SECTION 24-37.5-102 (20).

14 (d) "RURAL GRANT NAVIGATOR GRANT PROGRAM" OR  
15 "COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM" MEANS THE COMPETITIVE GRANT  
16 PROGRAM AUTHORIZED UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION.

17 (2) (a) THE FOREST SERVICE SHALL ESTABLISH A RURAL GRANT  
18 NAVIGATOR GRANT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE GRANT MONEY FOR  
19 NONGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING OUTREACH AND  
20 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, INCLUDING GRANT WRITING ASSISTANCE, TO  
21 RURAL COMMUNITIES SEEKING TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL OR STATE GRANTS

1 RELATED TO WILDFIRE MITIGATION AND PREPAREDNESS.

2 (b) ON OR AFTER MARCH 1, 2025, AN NGO ASSISTING ONE OR  
3 MORE RURAL COMMUNITIES WITH OBTAINING FEDERAL OR STATE GRANTS  
4 RELATED TO WILDFIRE MITIGATION OR PREPAREDNESS MAY APPLY TO THE  
5 FOREST SERVICE FOR GRANT MONEY IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPLICATION  
6 AND ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES THAT THE FOREST SERVICE ESTABLISHES  
7 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE COMPETITIVE  
8 GRANT PROGRAM.

9 (3) (a) THE FOREST SERVICE SHALL CONSULT WITH NGOS THAT  
10 CURRENTLY ASSIST OR ARE SEEKING TO ASSIST COLORADO COMMUNITIES  
11 WITH WILDFIRE MITIGATION AND PREPAREDNESS TO DEVELOP CRITERIA  
12 AND GUIDELINES FOR THE COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM.

13 (b) THE CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO  
14 SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION MUST:

15 (I) BE COMPLETED AND POSTED ON THE WEBSITE OF THE FOREST  
16 SERVICE ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 28, 2025; AND

17 (II) INCLUDE CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES FOR AT LEAST THE  
18 FOLLOWING ASPECTS OF THE COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM:

19 (A) ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR NGO APPLICANTS ASSISTING  
20 RURAL COMMUNITIES IN SEEKING FEDERAL OR STATE GRANT MONEY FOR  
21 WILDFIRE MITIGATION AND PREPAREDNESS EFFORTS;

22 (B) APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS; AND

23 (C) PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SELECTED NGOS,  
24 INCLUDING REQUIREMENTS FOR COORDINATION BETWEEN SELECTED  
25 NGOS TO ENSURE NONDUPLICATION OF EFFORTS AND FOR PERIODIC  
26 REPORTING.

27 (c) (I) AFTER THE FOREST SERVICE HAS CREATED THE COMPETITIVE

1 GRANT PROGRAM, THE FOREST SERVICE, TO THE BEST OF ITS ABILITY,  
2 SHALL CONSULT ON EFFECTIVE USES OF THE GRANT MONEY AND  
3 SUCCESSFUL OUTCOMES WITH:

4 (A) THE DEPARTMENT;

5 (B) THE DIVISION OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL CREATED IN  
6 SECTION 24-33.5-1201 (1)(a);

7 (C) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE;

8 (D) A RURAL COUNTY ON THE WESTERN SLOPE;

9 (E) A RURAL COUNTY ON THE EASTERN PLAINS; AND

10 (F) A RURAL COUNTY IN THE SOUTHERN PART OF THE STATE.

11 (II) THE FOREST SERVICE, IN CONSULTATION WITH SELECTED  
12 NGOs, SHALL DEVELOP METRICS TO HELP THE FOREST SERVICE ASSESS  
13 THE SUCCESS OF THE COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM.

14 (4) (a) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1, 2026, AND ON OR BEFORE MARCH  
15 1 EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE FOREST SERVICE SHALL SUBMIT A  
16 WRITTEN REPORT SUMMARIZING THE COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO  
17 THE WILDFIRE MATTERS REVIEW COMMITTEE CREATED IN SECTION  
18 2-3-1602 (1)(a) OR, IF THE COMMITTEE NO LONGER EXISTS, TO BOTH THE  
19 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AGRICULTURE, WATER, AND NATURAL  
20 RESOURCES COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL  
21 RESOURCES COMMITTEE, OR THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES. THE FOREST  
22 SERVICE SHALL POST COPIES OF THE REPORTS ON ITS WEBSITE.

23 (b) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), THE WRITTEN  
24 REPORT SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (4)(a) OF THIS SECTION CONTINUES  
25 INDEFINITELY.

26 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
27 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

1 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except  
2 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V  
3 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this  
4 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take  
5 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
6 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
