A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT A CORONER BE CERTIFIED BY THE
102	AMERICAN BOARD OF MEDICOLEGAL DEATH INVESTIGATORS OR
103	THE AMERICAN BOARD OF PATHOLOGY IN FORENSIC
104	PATHOLOGY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires a coroner of a county with a population greater than 150,000 to be either a death investigator certified by and in good standing with the American board of medicolegal death investigators or a forensic pathologist certified by and in good standing with the American board of pathology (qualifications). County commissioners of a county with a population of 150,000 or less may impose the qualifications upon an affirmative majority vote of the commissioners.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-10-601.5, amend
3	(1)(b) and (1)(c); and add (1)(d) as follows:
4	30-10-601.5. Qualifications - fingerprints. (1) A person is
5	eligible to hold the office of coroner if the person:
6	(b) Has earned a high school diploma or its equivalent or a college
7	degree; and
8	(c) Has given a set of fingerprints in accordance with subsection
9	(2) of this section; AND
10	(d) FOR A CORONER ELECTED ON OR AFTER NOVEMBER 5, 2024,
11	IN A COUNTY WITH A POPULATION GREATER THAN ONE HUNDRED FIFTY
12	THOUSAND, IS A DEATH INVESTIGATOR CERTIFIED BY AND IN GOOD
13	STANDING WITH THE AMERICAN BOARD OF MEDICOLEGAL DEATH
14	INVESTIGATORS OR IS A FORENSIC PATHOLOGIST CERTIFIED BY AND IN
15	GOOD STANDING WITH THE AMERICAN BOARD OF PATHOLOGY; OR

17	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
18	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
19	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
20	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
21	institutions.
