## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING FLEXIBLE SCHEDULING OPTIONS FOR CORRECTIONS
OFFICERS THAT RESULT IN DIFFERENCES IN OVERTIME PAY.

## Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Under current law, a corrections officer who works 12 or more hours in a single 24 -hour period receives overtime pay for the hours worked in excess of 8.5 hours. The bill creates an exception if the time is part of a corrections officer's normal shift that is longer than 8.5 hours and is part of a compressed, flexible, or alternative scheduling system.

[^0]Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 17-1-115.8, amend (3) introductory portion and (3)(b) as follows:

17-1-115.8. Corrections officer staffing - report - double shift criteria - definition. (3) The department, through discussions with employees Individual corrections officers, shall establish work period and compensation practices that comply with the following standards that:
(b) Correetions offieers A CORRECTIONS OFFICER who work works twelve or more hours in one A SINGLE twenty-four-hour period shall MUST be paid the amount of one and one-half times their THE CORRECTIONS OFFICER'S regular rate of pay for the time they THE CORRECTIONS OFFICER worked that exceeded eight and one-half hours, unless the additional time is part of the corrections officer's NORMAL SHIFT THAT IS LONGER THAN EIGHT AND ONE-HALF HOURS AND IS Part of a COMpressed, flexible, or alternative scheduling SYSTEM;

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.
