101	CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE REGULATION OF PHYSICAL
102	THERAPY PRACTICE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
103	IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE
104	2023 SUNSET REPORT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - House Health and Human Services **Committee.** The bill continues the regulation of physical therapists and HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading April 23, 2024

physical therapy assistants until September 1, 2035. The bill also authorizes physical therapists to recommend and prescribe durable medical equipment to patients without a prescription from a physician.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-104, amend
3	(6)(a)(II) introductory portion, (6)(a)(II)(E), and (6)(a)(II)(F); and add
4	(6)(a)(II)(G) as follows:
5	12-285-104. Definitions. As used in this article 285, unless the
6	context otherwise requires:
7	(6) (a) (II) For purposes of AS USED IN this article 285, "physical
8	therapy" includes:
9	(E) The provision of consultative, educational, and other advisory
10	services for the purpose of reducing the incidence and severity of physical
11	disability, movement dysfunction, bodily malfunction, and pain; and
12	(F) General wound care, including the assessment and
13	management of skin lesions, surgical incisions, open wounds, and areas
14	of potential skin breakdown in order to maintain or restore the
15	integumentary system; AND
16	(G) The authorization to directly recommend and
17	PRESCRIBE DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT TO PATIENTS WITHOUT
18	REQUESTING A PRESCRIPTION FROM A LICENSED PHYSICIAN.
19	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 12-285-132
20	as follows:
21	12-285-132. Repeal of part - review of functions. This part 1
22	and the licensing functions of the board as set forth in this part 1 are
23	repealed, effective September 1, 2024 SEPTEMBER 1, 2035. Before the
24	repeal, the licensing functions of the board are scheduled for review in

1 accordance with section 24-34-104.

2 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 12-285-220
3 as follows:

12-285-220. Repeal of part - review of functions. This part 2 is
repealed, effective September 1, 2024 SEPTEMBER 1, 2035. Before the
repeal, the functions of the board in regulating physical therapist
assistants under this part 2 are scheduled for review in accordance with
section 24-34-104.

9 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal
10 (25)(a)(XVIII) and (25)(a)(XIX); and add (36) as follows:

24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
 and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative
 declaration - repeal. (25) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2024:

15 (XVIII) The licensing of physical therapists by the physical
16 therapy board in accordance with part 1 of article 285 of title 12;

17 (XIX) The certification of physical therapist assistants by the
18 physical therapy board in accordance with part 2 of article 285 of title 12;
19 (36) (a) THE FOLLOWING AGENCIES, FUNCTIONS, OR BOTH, ARE

20 SCHEDULED FOR REPEAL ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2035:

(I) THE LICENSING OF PHYSICAL THERAPISTS BY THE PHYSICAL
THERAPY BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH PART 1 OF ARTICLE 285 OF TITLE
12;

(II) THE CERTIFICATION OF PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANTS BY
THE PHYSICAL THERAPY BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH PART 2 OF ARTICLE
285 OF TITLE 12.

2	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-104, amend
3	(4), (6)(a)(II)(E), (6)(a)(II)(F), and (6)(b)(III); and add (6)(a)(II)(G) as
4	follows:
5	12-285-104. Definitions. As used in this article 285, unless the
6	context otherwise requires:
7	(4) "Physical therapist" means a person who is licensed to practice
8	physical therapy. The terms TERM "physiotherapist" and "physical therapy
9	technician" are IS synonymous with the term "physical therapist".
10	(6) (a) (II) For purposes of this article 285, "physical therapy"
11	includes:
12	(E) The provision of consultative, educational, and other advisory
13	services for the purpose of reducing the incidence and severity of physical
14	disability, movement dysfunction, bodily malfunction, and pain; and
15	(F) General wound care AND WOUND DEBRIDEMENT, including the
16	assessment and management of skin lesions, surgical incisions, open
17	wounds, and areas of potential skin breakdown in order to maintain or
18	restore the integumentary system. WOUND DEBRIDEMENT INCLUDES SHARP
19	DEBRIDEMENT AND NONSHARP DEBRIDEMENT, SUCH AS MECHANICAL,
20	AUTOLYTIC, ENZYMATIC, AND MAGGOT.
21	(G) ONGOING REVIEW, INTEGRATION, AND UNDERSTANDING OF A
22	PATIENT'S OR CLIENT'S PRESCRIPTION AND NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATION
23	REGIMEN, WITH CONSIDERATION OF ITS IMPACT ON HEALTH, FUNCTION,
24	MOVEMENT, AND DISABILITY.
25	(b) For the purposes of subsection (6)(a)(II) of this section:
26	(III) "Tests and measurements" includes, but is not limited to, tests
27	of muscle strength, force, endurance, and tone; reflexes and automatic

1 reactions; movement skill and accuracy; joint motion, mobility, and 2 stability; sensation and perception; peripheral nerve integrity; locomotor 3 skill, stability, and endurance; activities of daily living; cardiac, 4 pulmonary, and vascular functions; fit, function, and comfort of 5 prosthetic, orthotic, and other assistive devices; posture and body 6 mechanics; limb length, circumference, and volume; thoracic excursion 7 and breathing patterns; vital signs; nature and locus of pain and 8 conditions under which pain varies; photosensitivity; and physical home 9 and work environments MEANS STANDARD METHODS AND TECHNIQUES 10 USED TO OBTAIN DATA ABOUT THE PATIENT OR CLIENT, INCLUDING 11 DIAGNOSTIC IMAGING AND ELECTRODIAGNOSTIC AND 12 ELECTROPHYSIOLOGICAL TESTS AND MEASURES.

13 SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 12-285-107
14 as follows:

15 12-285-107. Use of titles restricted. (1) A person licensed as a 16 physical therapist may use the title "physical therapist" or the letters 17 "P.T." or any other generally accepted terms, letters, or figures that 18 indicate that the person is a physical therapist. No other person shall be 19 so designated or shall use the terms "physical therapist", "licensed physical therapist", "physiotherapist", "DOCTOR OF PHYSICAL THERAPY", 20 21 "DOCTOR OF PHYSIOTHERAPY", or "physical therapy technician", or the 22 letters "P.T.", or "L.P.T.", "P.T.A.", "D.P.T.", "R.P.T.", OR ANY LETTERS, 23 ABBREVIATIONS, OR INSIGNIA INDICATING OR IMPLYING THAT THE PERSON 24 IS A PHYSICAL THERAPIST UNLESS THE PERSON IS LICENSED PURSUANT TO 25 THIS ARTICLE 285.

26 (2) A PERSON ENROLLED AS A STUDENT PHYSICAL THERAPIST IN AN
 27 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE COMMISSION ON

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1 ACCREDITATION IN PHYSICAL THERAPY EDUCATION OR A COMPARABLE 2 ORGANIZATION, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, MAY USE THE TITLE 3 "STUDENT PHYSICAL THERAPIST". NO OTHER PERSON SHALL USE THE TERM 4 "STUDENT PHYSICAL THERAPIST" OR THE LETTERS "S.P.T." OR ANY 5 LETTERS, ABBREVIATIONS, OR INSIGNIA INDICATING OR IMPLYING THAT 6 THE PERSON IS A STUDENT PHYSICAL THERAPIST. 7 SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-113, amend 8 (1) introductory portion and (1)(b) as follows: 9 12-285-113. Licensing of internationally-educated applicants. 10 (1) Every foreign-trained applicant for licensing WHO IS EDUCATED BY A 11 PROGRAM THAT IS NOT ACCREDITED BY THE COMMISSION ON 12 ACCREDITATION IN PHYSICAL THERAPY EDUCATION OR A COMPARABLE 13 ORGANIZATION, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, shall: 14 (b) Possess an active, valid license in good standing or other 15 authorization to practice physical therapy from an appropriate authority 16 in the country where the foreign-trained applicant is practicing or has 17 practiced; 18 SECTION 8. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-116, amend 19 (3) as follows: 20 12-285-116. Special practice authorities and requirements -21 definition - rules. (3) Wound debridement. A physical therapist is 22 authorized to perform wound debridement under a physician's order, or 23 the order of a physician assistant authorized under section 12-240-107 24 (6), OR THE ORDER OF AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE 25 AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTION 12-255-111 when debridement is consistent 26 with the scope of physical therapy practice. The performance of wound 27 debridement does not violate the prohibition against performing surgery 1 pursuant to section 12-285-108(1)(a).

2 SECTION 9. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-203, add (3)
3 as follows:

4 **12-285-203.** Limitations on authority. (3) A PHYSICAL
5 THERAPIST ASSISTANT:

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(a) SHALL NOT PERFORM SHARP WOUND DEBRIDEMENT;

7 (b) MAY PERFORM GENERAL WOUND CARE AND NONSHARP
8 DEBRIDEMENT, INCLUDING MECHANICAL, AUTOLYTIC, ENZYMATIC, AND
9 MAGGOT, UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A PHYSICAL THERAPIST WHEN
10 DEBRIDEMENT IS CONSISTENT WITH THE SCOPE OF PHYSICAL THERAPY
11 PRACTICE.

SECTION 10. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-285-207, amend
(1) introductory portion and (1)(b) as follows:

14 12-285-207. Certification of internationally-educated
15 applicants. (1) Every foreign-trained applicant for certification who is
16 EDUCATED BY A PROGRAM THAT IS NOT ACCREDITED BY THE COMMISSION
17 ON ACCREDITATION IN PHYSICAL THERAPY EDUCATION OR A
18 COMPARABLE ORGANIZATION, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, shall:

(b) Possess an active, valid license, certification, or registration in
good standing or other authorization to practice as a physical therapist
assistant from an appropriate authority in the country where the
foreign-trained applicant is practicing or has practiced;

SECTION 11. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
