A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING IMPROVING RESOURCES FOR SCIENCE EDUCATORS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires the department of education to develop and offer a free, optional professional development program (program) to enhance pedagogy around research-based Colorado academic standards in science. The program must include instruction on interventions for students who are below grade level or struggling in science, children with disabilities, and students who are English language learners. The program must create incentives for teacher participation by offering ongoing professional development credit toward licensure renewal. The program prioritizes

professional development for eligible science teachers in rural school districts and small rural school districts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds and declares that: 4 (a) Access to high-quality, evidence-informed science instruction 5 means that students will develop an in-depth understanding of content, 6 develop key skills, and be prepared to fill the workforce needs of the 7 state; 8 (b) In 2018, the Colorado state board of education adopted the 9 Next Generation Science Standards, a set of research-based academic 10 standards designed to give local educators flexibility while holding 11 students to higher performance expectations in science; 12 (c) The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted Colorado public schools' 13 ability to measure student progress in science and implement supports for 14 the transition to the Next Generation Science Standards; 15 (d) State assessment results in 2023 showed low proficiency in 16 science among students in fifth, eighth, and eleventh grades; 17 Educators are the most important in-school support for 18 improving student outcomes in science; and 19 All teachers, regardless of their duration of time in the 20 classroom, deserve access to high-quality professional development 21 opportunities that align with the Next Generation Science Standards. 22 (2) The general assembly finds, therefore, that action is required 23 to better equip educators to deliver high-quality, evidence-informed 24 science instruction. 25 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 22-2-146.8 as

10	ELEMENT IN IMPLEMENTING ACCOUNTABLE PROGRAMS TO MEET STATE
11	ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND MAY THEREFORE RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE
12	STATE EDUCATION FUND CREATED IN SECTION 17 (4) OF ARTICLE IX OF
13	THE STATE CONSTITUTION.
14	(b) For the 2024-25 budget year, the general assembly
15	SHALL APPROPRIATE THREE MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE STATE
16	EDUCATION FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT. ANY MONEY APPROPRIATED
17	PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION THAT IS NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO JULY 1,
18	2025, remains available for expenditure for the same purpose in
19	THE $2026-27$ BUDGET YEAR WITHOUT FURTHER APPROPRIATION. AT THE
20	end of the $2026\text{-}27$ budget year, the money that is unexpended or
21	UNENCUMBERED REVERTS TO THE STATE EDUCATION FUND.
22	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
23	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
24	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
25	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
26	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
27	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take

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- 1 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 3 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
