#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$880,803 for FY 2024-25, including \$672,177 General Fund to the Department of Human Services, \$158,626 General Fund to the Judicial Department, and \$50,000 reappropriated funds to the Office of the Governor. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Human Services will require an additional 6.2

FTE, and the Judicial Department will require an additional 2.2 FTE to implement the act.

- **L.004** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) reduces workload in the Department of Human Services and the Judicial Department associated with records requests and reduces the fiscal impact of the amended bill by an estimated \$640,161 General Fund and 6.1 FTE.
- **L.005** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.005** (attached) changes language related to the evaluation of moderate to severe intellectual or developmental disabilities to reduce workload for competency evaluators in the Department of Human Services and reduces the fiscal impact of the bill by \$190,642 General Fund and 1.5 FTE.

Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that if both L.004 and L.005 are adopted, the bill can be implemented within existing resources and does not require an appropriation for FY 2024-25. The Committee must adopt both L.004 and L.005 to remove the total fiscal impact of the bill.

If the Committee adopts both L.004 and L.005, it should <u>not</u> adopt J.001.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$830,803 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount. The General Fund impact is removed if the Committee adopts **L.004** and **L.005**.
