Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of

\$376,724 General Fund to the Department of Labor and Employment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 2.2 FTE. Of this amount, \$161,111 is reappropriated to the Office of Information Technology in the Governor's Office.

L.010 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.010** (attached) eliminates reporting requirements in the bill and moves the effective date for enforcement activities forward. Legislative Council Staff and JBC staff agree the amendment reduces expenditures to implement the bill from \$376,724 to \$163,409 General Fund in FY 2024-25. This fiscal impact is detailed in the attached memo at the end of this packet. Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached), adds a provision appropriating a total of \$163,409 General Fund to the Department of Labor and Employment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 1.6 FTE.

If the Committee adopts L.010, it should adopt J.002 and should NOT adopt J.001.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill, as amended by the Business Affairs and Labor Committee Report (02/29/24), requires a General Fund appropriation of \$376,724 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.

If **L.010** is adopted, the bill will require a General Fund appropriation of \$163,409 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.
