Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$462,335 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2024-25. Of this amount, \$20,739 is reappropriated to the Department of Law. This provision also

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states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Public Health and Environment will require an additional 4.0 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.1 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$462,335 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.

TABOR/ Excess State Revenues Impact

This bill is estimated to increase cash fund revenues by \$190,202 in FY 2025-26, which will reduce the available General Fund in FY 2025-26 by an equal amount.
