Summary of Legislation

If approved by voters at the 2024 election, this resolution changes deadlines for certain filings in elections. Deadlines for filing initiative petitions, referendum petitions, and declaration of intent for judges and justices will all be moved up one week. Under current law, nonpartisan research staff publish the text and titles of ballot measures at least 15 days before an election. This resolution extends that period to 45 days.

State Expenditures

Election expenditure impact — **existing appropriations.** This bill includes a referred measure that will appear before voters at the November 2024 general election. While no additional appropriation is required, certain election costs are incurred by the state when ballot measures are referred. These include reimbursing counties for certain election costs; publishing the text and title of the measure in newspapers across the state; and preparing and mailing the ballot information booklet.

Other state agencies. The resolution may increase efficiencies for staff in the Secretary of State and the Legislative Department by increasing the time available to process certain elections filing. These impacts do not require any change in appropriations.

Effective Date

If approved by voters at the 2024 general election, this measure takes effect upon proclamation of the Governor, no later than 30 days after the official canvass of the vote is completed.
