#### (1) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

Provides trained and ready forces to the U.S. active armed services and provides trained and ready forces for the preservation of life and property during natural disasters and civil emergencies in Colorado. Starting in FY 2010-11, the State's support for the Civil Air Patrol is shown in this Division. The cash funds sources are armory rental fees, the Western Slope Military Veterans' Cemetery Fund; real estate proceeds; and the Distance Learning Cash Fund. The reappropriated funds source is the Colorado Commission on Higher Education financial assistance program.

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#### (1) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

The Executive Director and Army National Guard Office is responsible for the overall administration of the Department. It provides leadership to the Department by managing the general administrative functions, which include: Leadership and Policy Development; Human Resource Management; Accounting; Purchasing/Contracting; Budgeting; and Information Technology. Except for the Leadership and Policy Development, each of the functions has multiple operations within the Department representing different state and federal responsibilities of the Department. The Executive Director's office is also responsible for the legislative program of the Department at both the state and federal level.

The Army and Air National Guards are each separate entities, funded by the federal government and managed and staffed by Federal Civil Service employees. The federal government fully funds National Guard training and provides most of the funding for construction of armories and other military facilities. Under its cooperative agreements with the federal government, the Department provides 50 percent of maintenance and utilities costs at fifteen state owned armories, and 20 or 25 percent of these costs at four federal facilities.

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The line item funds 33.3 FTE for administrative and professional staff in the Executive Director and Army National Guard office, and the labor trades and crafts employees who maintain and repair armories and other military facilities. The Department's request is for \$2,025,426 and 33.3 FTE, including \$1,796,901 General Fund, \$3,786 cash funds, and \$224,739 federal funds. For FY 2010-11, the 1.0 FTE from the Civil Air Patrol Division was transferred to this line item, and 1.0 FTE was transferred to the Governor's Office of Information Technology.

**Staff recommends an appropriation of \$2,031,287 and 33.3 FTE**, including \$1,806,284 General Fund, \$3,729 cash funds and \$221,274 federal funds.

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#### HEALTH, LIFE AND DENTAL

This line provides funding for the employer's share of group benefit plans providing health, life and dental insurance for state employees. The Department requests \$633,667, including \$173,415 General Fund, \$16,583 cash funds, and \$443,669 federal funds.

**Pursuant to Committee common policy, staff recommends** and appropriation of \$636,077, including \$173,825 General Fund, \$16,583 cash funds, and \$443,669 federal funds. This recommendation includes the effect of the bill to pro-rate benefits for part-time employees.

#### **SHORT-TERM DISABILITY**

This line provides funding for the employer's share of state employee's short-term disability insurance premiums. The Department requests \$11,675, including \$4,000 General Fund, \$129 cash funds, and \$7,546 federal funds.

**Pursuant to Committee common policy, staff recommends** and appropriation of \$11,768, including \$4,032 General Fund, \$130 cash funds, and \$7,606 federal funds.

#### S.B. 04-157 AMORTIZATION EQUALIZATION DISBURSEMENT

Pursuant to S.B. 04-157, the line provides additional funding to increase the state contribution for the Public Employees Retirement Association (PERA). The Department requests \$184,686, including \$63,277 General Fund, \$2,043 cash funds, and \$119,366 cash funds.

**Pursuant to Committee common policy, staff recommends** and appropriation of \$185,305, including \$63,489 General Fund, \$2,050 cash funds, and \$119,766 federal funds.

#### S.B. 06-235 SUPPLEMENTAL AMORTIZATION EQUALIZATION DISBURSEMENT

Pursuant to S.B. 06-235, the line provides additional funding to increase the state contribution for the Public Employees Retirement Association (PERA). The Department requests \$148,407, including \$50,847 General Fund, \$1,641 cash funds, and \$95,919 federal funds.

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**Pursuant to Committee common policy, staff recommends** and appropriation of \$148,524, including \$50,887 General Fund, \$1,642 cash funds, and \$95,995 federal funds.

#### SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL

This line item provides funding for shift premiums for personnel working other than a work week of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The Department requests \$21,474 federal funds.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### **WORKERS' COMPENSATION**

This line item provides funding to pay the Department's estimated share for inclusion in the State's workers' compensation program for state employees, which is administered by the Department of Personal and Administration. The Department requests \$70,954, including \$24,124 General Fund and \$46,830 federal funds.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### **OPERATING EXPENSES**

This line item provides funding to pay the Department's expenses for supplies, telephone, training, minor armory repair and maintenance, utility expenses, travel and the general operational expenses for the Department. The Department requests a continuing appropriation of \$2,061,937, including \$1,182,490 General Fund, \$46,000 cash funds, and \$833,447 federal funds. The Department's request includes a statewide decision item for printing of statewide warrants and mainframe documents. The Committee did <u>not</u> approve that request in its consideration of common policies, and that request is not reflected in the staff recommendation.

**Staff recommends approving the Department's request** for a continuing appropriation of \$2,056,770, including \$1,181,198 General Fund, \$46,000 cash funds, and \$829,572 federal funds.

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#### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ASSET MAINTENANCE

This line item provides funding for the upkeep and maintenance of the Department's information technology infrastructure. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$22,372 General Fund..

**Staff recommends approving the Department's request** for an appropriation of \$22,372 General Fund.

#### **LEGAL SERVICES FOR 110 HOURS**

This line items funds the provision of legal services from the Department of Law. The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs requests a continuation appropriation of \$7,923 General Fund, and 110 hours of legal services for lawsuits, workers' compensation cases, and contract review.

Staff recommends a continuation of 110 hours of legal services. Staff recommendation for the appropriation is pending Committee common policy where the hourly rate for legal services will be set. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### PURCHASE OF SERVICES FROM COMPUTER CENTER

This line item provides funding for the Department's use of the centralized computer system maintained by the Office of Information Technology (OIT). Based on rates charged by OIT, the Department requests an appropriation of \$172,939 General Fund, which includes a statewide common policy adjustment of \$38,939 General Fund.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

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#### **MULTIUSE NETWORK PAYMENTS**

This line item provides funding for the Department's costs for inclusion in the State's network. Based on rates charged by OIT, the Department's requests an appropriation of \$59,706 General Fund includes a statewide common policy adjustment of \$36,546 General Fund.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

# MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF OIT

This line item provides funding for the Department's share of the operations of the Office of Information Technology in the Governor's Office. Based on rates charged by OIT, the Department requests an appropriation of \$61,356 General Fund, which includes a statewide common policy adjustment of \$1,259 General Fund.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### PAYMENT TO RISK MANAGEMENT AND PROPERTY FUNDS

This line item funds the Department's costs of the State's self-insurance program for risk management and property. This line is increased by a Statewide common policy adjustment The Department requests an appropriation of \$153,916 General Fund, an increase of \$115,192 from the FY 2010-11 Long Bill appropriation.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

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#### **VEHICLE LEASE PAYMENTS**

This line item provides funding for the leasing costs of the Department's vehicle fleet. The Department requests an appropriation of \$43,548 General Fund. The request includes an adjustment for a statewide common policy adjustment of the vehicle fleet replacements that decreases the request by \$8,898 General Fund.

The Department is not requesting any new or replacement vehicles for FY 2011-12. **Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### LEASED SPACE

This line item funds the lease for the offices of the Division of Veterans Affairs located at 7465 E. First Avenue in Denver. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$44,978 General Fund.

**Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request** for a continuation appropriation of \$44,978 General Fund.

#### CAPITOL COMPLEX LEASED SPACE

This line item provides funding for buildings at Camp George West occupied by the Colorado National Guard. The Department requests an appropriation of \$85,424, comprised of \$54,698 General Fund and \$30,726 federal funds. This request reflects a statewide common policy adjustment that decreases the total requested appropriation by \$3,776, including a decrease of \$9,962 General Fund and an increase of \$6,186 federal funds.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

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#### **COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES PAYMENTS**

This line item funds the Department's costs for network and telephone communications services and the digital trunked radio network. The Department requests \$12,400 General Fund, which reflects a statewide common policy adjustment of \$237 General Fund.

**Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy**. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

#### **CIVIL AIR PATROL OPERATIONS**

In the 2010 session, the General Assembly approved consolidating the Civil Air Patrol Division with the Executive Director and Army National Guard Division. This line item combined two line items from the Civil Air Patrol Division, Operating Expenses and Aircraft Maintenance. The funding is used to assist in paying for some of Civil Air Patrol's operating and maintenance expenses. The bulk of the expenditures for these programs continue to come from the Federal Government and donations that are not included in the Long Bill. The Department has requested continuation funding of \$58,638 General Fund.

**Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request** for a continuing appropriation of \$58,638 General Fund.

#### LOCAL ARMORY INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The Department has statutory authority to expend armory rental proceeds for the costs of operating armories outside of normal hours. The spending authority is needed for the costs of the use of the armories for extended hours. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$46,610 cash funds from armory rental proceeds.

**Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request** for a continuing appropriation of \$46,610 cash funds from armory rental proceeds.

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#### **DISTANCE LEARNING**

This line item provides spending authority for revenues received from the use of the Department's distance learning facilities. The Department requests \$3,000 cash funds from fees on distance learning facilities and equipment.

**Staff recommends approving the Department's request** for a continuing appropriation of \$3,000 cash funds from fees on distance learning facilities and equipment.

#### **COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD TUITION FUND**

This line item provides funding for tuition assistance for members of the Colorado National Guard who are attending state universities and colleges. The Department is requesting a continuation appropriation of \$1,046,157, comprised of \$246,157 General Fund and \$800,000 reappropriated funds from the Colorado Commission on Higher Education.

**Staff recommends approving the Department's request** for a continuing appropriation of \$1,046,157, including \$246,157 General Fund and \$800,000 reappropriated funds.

#### ARMY NATIONAL GUARD COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This line item funds programs that are 100 percent federally funded under the Department's cooperative agreements with the U.S. National Guard Bureau, which includes funding for 51.5 federally funded FTE, and the operations and maintenance of the Colorado Army National Guard program. The line contains both personal services and operating expenses. The Department requests an appropriation of \$3,491,693 federal funds and 51.5 FTE, of which \$2,488,355 is for personal services and \$1,058,329 is for operating expenses. The request is adjusted for the PERA Contribution shift, a reduction of \$54,991

**Staff recommends an appropriation of \$3,454,368 federal funds and 51.5 FTE.** This is comprised of \$2,396,039 for personal services and \$1,058,329 for operating expenses. The recommendation includes \$2,396,039 for personal services and \$1,058,329 for operating expenses.

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#### (2) DIVISION OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Division represents veterans in federal benefits claims, provides information and training to county veterans service officers, and operates and maintains the Western Slope Military Veterans Cemetery in Grand Junction. The State Board of Veterans Affairs advises the Division on matters pertaining to veterans, makes grants from the Colorado Veterans Trust Fund for: capital improvements and amenities at state veterans nursing homes, costs of state veterans cemeteries; costs of the Division, and for veterans programs operated by non-profit veterans organizations. The Trust Fund moneys are the result of a transfer of one percent, up to \$1 million, of the proceeds from the Master Tobacco Settlement.

#### **VETERANS SERVICE OPERATIONS**

This line item provides funding for salaries and employer contributions to PERA for employees who are responsible for assisting veterans in obtaining benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. These employees also assist county veterans service officers with their duties and training for those officers. This line also provides funding for the operating and administrative expenses of the program. The program has 8.0 FTE, whose staff functions are broken out in the table below.

**Staff recommends an appropriation of \$594,101,** comprised of \$540,592 General Fund, \$50,000 cash funds from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund, and \$3,509 reappropriated funds from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund. The recommendation includes \$490,592 for personal services and \$103,509 for operating expenses.

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#### COUNTY VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER PAYMENTS

This line item funds payments to counties for administrative support of county veterans service officers. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$190,564 General Fund.

Section 28-5-801 (1), C.R.S. requires each county to appoint a County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO). Some counties have one or more full-time CVSO, others have a part-time or volunteer CVSO, while at least two counties share a CVSO with another county. The state reimburses the counties at the rate of \$200 per month for a part-time officer and \$400 per month for a full-time officer. The appropriation for this program is \$88,800, while counties report that they spent more than \$1.2 million in support of the program.

The Department also has a pilot program in five counties to reimburse counties for increasing their efforts to enroll veterans with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Enrolling additional veterans has the potential to bring additional federal dollars to the state in the form of veterans pensions, health care, vocational rehabilitation and employment, education and training, home loans, life insurance, and other benefits. The original appropriation for the program was \$124,354 General Fund, however, due to the General Fund revenue shortfall, that appropriation was reduced to \$79,264 in FY 2008-09. The appropriation was set at \$101,854 for FY 2009-10 and FY 2010-11. The FY 2011-12 budget request is a continuation of the FY 2010-11 appropriation.

Staff recommends an appropriation of \$190,654 General Fund.

#### COLORADO STATE VETERANS TRUST FUND EXPENDITURES

The Colorado State Veterans Trust fund is funded by a transfer of one percent, up to \$1 million, of the moneys the State receives from the Master Tobacco Settlement (MSA). Under current statute (Section 28-5-709 (3) (c), C.R.S.), 90 percent of the moneys transferred, plus any accumulated interest, are subject to appropriation by the General Assembly for the purposes of: capital improvements and amenities at state veterans nursing homes, costs of state veterans cemeteries; costs of the Division, and for veterans programs operated by non-profit veterans organizations. The Department requests an appropriation of \$949,690 cash funds from the Veterans Trust Fund.

The Department's request is comprised of 90 percent of the transfer of moneys from the Master Tobacco Settlement, or \$900,000 and the interest earnings on the fund of \$49,690 The Department calculated its request on the basis of receiving the full \$1 million allowable from these Master Settlement Agreement.

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**Staff recommends an appropriation of \$811,789 cash funds** from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund. Staff's recommendation is based upon the Legislative Council Economic Staff estimate of the transfer of moneys from the proceeds of the MSA. That estimate is for a transfer of \$902,332 during FY 2011-12. Ninety percent of the transferred funds are available for appropriation by the General Assembly, which is \$812,099. Interest earnings of \$49,690 are added to the transfer, and \$50,000 recommended to be appropriated from the trust fund to Veterans Service Operations is deducted from this line's appropriation, for a recommended appropriation \$811,789.

#### WESTERN SLOPE MILITARY VETERANS CEMETERY

This line item provides funding for personal services costs for the employees who operate and maintain the Cemetery, as well as the operating costs (utilities, routine maintenance, minor construction and improvement, as well as administrative costs) for the Cemetery. The Department is requesting an appropriation of \$408,569 and 4.5 FTE, comprised of \$130,079 General Fund, \$227,940 cash funds from the Western Slope Military Veterans Cemetery Fund, and \$51,000 federal funds from interment fees from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Personal Services functions are detailed in the following table.

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# (4) FEDERAL FUNDED PROGRAMS

This section is included for information only. It describes funding that is managed by the Department but which is not subject to state appropriation and does not flow through the state accounting system. These programs provide training one weekend per month and two weeks per year for members of the Colorado National Guard. The requested level of federal funding reflects estimates of the federal appropriation for federal fiscal year 2011, which runs from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011. These expenses are not subject to either the 1.5 percent base reduction nor the 2.5 percent PERA contribution swap.

Staff recommends reflecting an appropriation \$205,646,369 federal funds and 1,239.0 FTE.

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#### LONG BILL FOOTNOTES

Staff recommendations are provided below for Department footnotes in the FY 2011-12 Long Bill:

N Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Federal Funded Programs – These federal funds are shown for informational purposes. These funds are not to be included in the spending authority for the Department because these funds do not flow through the accounting system of the state. It is the intent of the General Assembly that these programs, funding, and FTE are included to demonstrate the full scope of activities of the Department of Military Affairs.

Comment: Staff recommends continuing this footnote.

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#### BUDGET BALANCING OPTIONS

One area in this Department where options exist to reduce General Fund to balance the budget is in the Department of Veterans Affairs, where some options that could be taken include refinancing General Fund with cash funding from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund, or the elimination of some payments to counties. **Staff doe <u>not</u> recommend any of these options,** but does provide the Committee with the following information about its options.

#### Veterans Trust Fund Background

The Colorado State Veterans Trust fund is funded by a transfer of one percent, up to \$1 million, of the moneys the State receives from the Master Tobacco Settlement (MSA). Under current statute (Section 28-5-709 (3) (c), C.R.S.), 90 percent of the moneys transferred, plus any accumulated interest, are subject to appropriation by the General Assembly for the purposes of: capital improvements and amenities at state veterans nursing homes, costs of state veterans cemeteries; costs of the Division, and for veterans programs operated by non-profit veterans organizations.

There is an opportunity for the Committee to consider refinancing additional General Fund in the Division of Veterans Affairs with moneys from the Veterans Trust Fund (VTF). During the last downturn in the economy, the General Assembly refinanced between \$100,000 and \$120,000 for three fiscal years (FY 2002-03, FY 2003-04, and FY 2004-05) from the VTF. In addition, the General Assembly transferred \$2.3 million from the VTF to the General Fund in FY 2002-03. This amount was repaid with interest in FY 2008-09.

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Programs supported by the VTF were not affected as the statute was changed to allow up to 75 percent of the proceeds of the annual Tobacco Settlement moneys, plus any accumulated interest, to be appropriated each fiscal year. The following table shows the actual expenditures from the trust fund.

As illustrated in the table, the expenditures in support of veterans organizations increased significantly twice during this period. The first was when the percentage of the tobacco moneys transferred to the VTF that was allowed to be appropriated was increased from 25 percent to 75 percent in FY 2003-04. The second occurred when the percentage of the tobacco moneys transferred was increased to 90 percent in FY 2009-10.

For FY 2009-10 forward, the General Assembly has approved a partial refinance of \$50,000 General Fund with moneys from the VTF. Even with that refinance, expenditures from the VTF increased in FY 2010-11. The decrease in funding for FY 2011-12 is the result of revenues from the tobacco settlement be lower than the maximum by about 10 percent. In addition, interest earning on the VTF are decreased because of the use of VTF moneys for the purchase of land, design, and construction of armories authorized by H.B. 10-1140.

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#### Refinance Veterans Service Operations

The Veterans Service Operations were partially refinanced in the 2010 Long Bill. The Department had proposed a \$50,000 cut in the appropriation. Staff recommended refinancing the \$50,000 with funding from the VTF. Staff's rationale was that the Colorado State Board of Veterans Affairs had approved a grant to the Department to replace the moneys proposed for reduction, and staff felt that it was unwise to give the Department spending authority that was not in the appropriation. The reasoning behind staff's recommendation was that the reduction would cut programs with benefit to the Veterans in the State and the refinancing option would keep those programs running at their previously appropriated funding levels.

The Committee has the option to increase the amount of General Fund that it refinanced in 2010.

#### Eliminate, Reduce or Refinance County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO) payments.

Section 28-5-801 (1), C.R.S. requires each county to establish a County Veterans Service Office and appoint one or more County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO). Section 28-5-707 (1), C.R.S. authorizes, subject to available appropriations, the Division of Veterans Affairs to reimburse counties for their expenses in support of the County Veterans Service Offices. For FY 2010-11, the appropriation was \$190,654 General Fund.

There are two elements to these payments. The first is a reimbursement to each county for part of their costs in administering the program. The appropriation for this element is \$88,800.

The second element is a pilot program established in FY 2008-09 for several counties that receive additional reimbursements based upon their success in signing up veterans eligible for the receipt of federal Veterans Administration benefits. The appropriation for this program is currently set at \$101,584. The Committee could reduce these payments or it could zero them out. Alternatively, the Committee could chose to refinance these payments with moneys from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund.

In 2008, the Department surveyed the counties and found that counties were expending in excess of \$1.2 million annually on the county veterans service officers, while state reimbursement was (at that time) \$88,800. Even including the pilot program, state reimbursement to counties was less than 20 percent of the amount counties spend on the program.

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#### Refinance General Fund for Western Slope Military Veterans Cemetery.

The Western Slope Military Veterans' Cemetery was established to provide a veterans cemetery in Western Colorado. The federal government paid for the construction, but the State must operate the cemetery for 20 years or repay those construction costs. The recommended appropriation for FY 2011-12 is \$408,569 total funds, including \$130,755 General Fund.

The Committee has the option to replace the General Fund with moneys from the VTF.
