

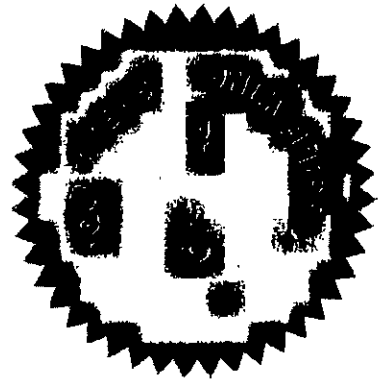

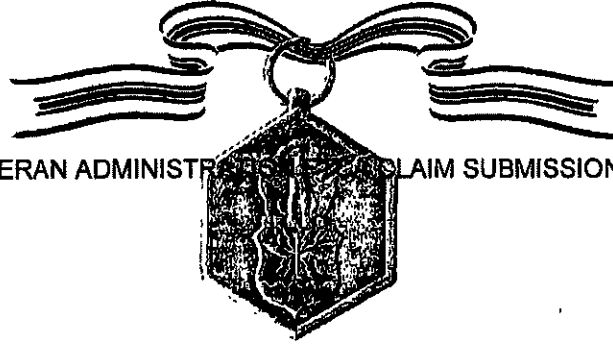
CITATION TO ACCOMPANY THE AWARD OF

Captain David A. Richeson distinguished himself by meritorious service while assigned to the 10th Missile Squadron and the 341st Operations Support Squadron, 341st Operations Group, 341st Missile Wing, Malmstrom Air Force Base, Montana, from 3 August 1993 to 20 June 1997. As a deputy missile combat crew commander, he served as an operations crew member and public affairs officer for "Glory Trip 158GM Task Force, 1994" to conduct the first follow-on test and evaluation launch of a Minuteman III Intercontinental Ballistic Missile with a single Mark 12 reentry vehicle. As a certified combat crew instructor, he authored and programmed over 25 missile procedure trainer scripts and provided hundreds of hours of instruction for the 270 combat crew members of the 341st Operations Group. Because of his leadership and expertise, he was selected to represent the 341st Missile Wing at "Guardian Sword, 97-01," a task force to proactively improve nuclear weapon procedures. In addition to his combat crew achievements, Captain Richeson also contributed immensely to his squadron's quality of life as a resource advisor and project officer for the installation of over \$400,000 of modular furniture in two operations squadrons. The distinctive accomplishments of Captain Richeson reflect credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.





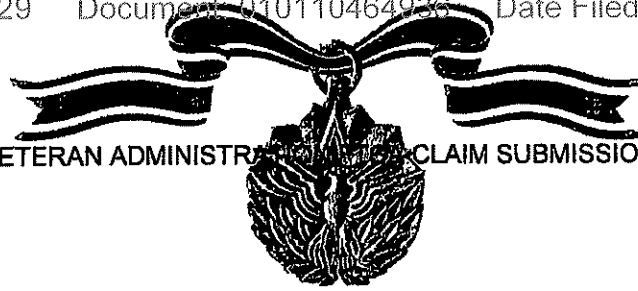
