"Limited Gaming Codify Executive Orders" (HB21-1296)

CONCERNING THE CODIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS PERTAINING TO LIMITED GAMING, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, ALLOWING LICENSE APPLICANTS TO SUBMIT FINGERPRINTS AFTER THE INITIAL SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION, ELIMINATING THE STATUTORY LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF PLAYERS PERMITTED IN THE GAME OF BLACKJACK, AND ALLOWING A CASINO OPERATOR TO DIVIDE ITS LAWFUL GAMING SPACE INTO MORE THAN TWO NONCONTIGUOUS SPACES.

During COVID-19 Crisis, Governor Polis Issued Two Executive Orders that Allow for Required Social Distancing in Colorado Casinos:

- **Executive Order D2020-173 Suspended Statutory Player Limits on Any Games of Blackjack or Prohibits Casinos from Dividing Gaming Space into More than Two Noncontiguous Areas.**
- **Executive Order D2020-283 Suspended the Requirement that Limited Gaming and Sports Betting Applicants Must Submit Fingerprints with an Application and Instead Allows Fingerprint Submission Prior to Issuance of Permanent Gaming License.**

Codification of Governor Polis' Gaming Executive Orders as follows:

- **Repeal Gaming Statute that Prohibits More than Seven Players in Any Game of Blackjack in Colorado Casinos.**
- **Repeal Gaming Statute that Limits Any Casino Operator to Only Two-Noncontiguous Gaming Areas in Colorado Casinos.**
- **Revise Gaming Statute to Allow Applicants for Colorado Gaming or Sports Betting Licenses to Submit their Fingerprints After Application but Before Issuance of Permanent Gaming License.**

(Note: For Both U.S. & Foreign Limited Gaming or Sports Betting License Applicants.)
