## HOUSE COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AMENDMENT

Committee on Judiciary.SB18-252 be amended as follows:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 28, after line 12 insert:

2 "SECTION 12. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-60-105, amend  
3 (5) as follows:

4 **27-60-105. Outpatient restoration to competency services -**  
5 **legislative declaration - responsible entity - duties - report.** (5) On or  
6 before January 1, 2019, and every January 1 thereafter, the office shall  
7 submit an annual written report to the general assembly summarizing the  
8 office's provision of competency EVALUATION AND restoration ~~education~~  
9 SERVICES and its efforts toward the coordination of competency  
10 restoration ~~education~~ SERVICES with other existing services. The report  
11 must include:

12 (a) Data on the number of individuals ordered to FOR competency  
13 restoration services EVALUATIONS, the average time frame for beginning  
14 and ending such services EVALUATIONS, the types of settings in which  
15 competency restoration services THE EVALUATIONS are provided, and the  
16 outcomes of such services THE NUMBER OF EVALUATIONS CONDUCTED IN  
17 EACH SETTING, THE NUMBER OF EVALUATIONS THAT RESULTED IN  
18 FINDINGS OF INCOMPETENCY BY THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE NUMBER OF  
19 INDIVIDUALS ORDERED FOR RESTORATION SERVICES AFTER A FINDING OF  
20 INCOMPETENCY BY THE DEPARTMENT OR BY ANOTHER EVALUATION;

21 (a.5) DATA ON THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS ORDERED TO  
22 COMPETENCY RESTORATION SERVICES, THE LIST OF ALL SETTINGS IN  
23 WHICH COMPETENCY RESTORATIONS WERE PROVIDED, THE NUMBER OF  
24 INDIVIDUALS SERVED IN EACH OF THE COMPETENCY RESTORATION  
25 SETTINGS, THE AVERAGE TIME FRAME FOR BEGINNING AND ENDING  
26 SERVICES IN EACH SETTING, THE OUTCOMES OF RESTORATION SERVICES IN  
27 EACH SETTING, AND THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO WERE DETERMINED  
28 TO BE INCOMPETENT AND ORDERED TO RECEIVE RESTORATION SERVICES  
29 MORE THAN ONE TIME WITHIN THE DURATION OF A CASE AND IN WHAT  
30 SETTING SUCH SERVICES WERE DELIVERED;

31 (b) A description of the office's engagement with community  
32 partners to coordinate competency restoration services in an effective and  
33 efficient manner;

34 (c) Identification of best and promising practices for education  
35 and coordination of competency restoration services;

36 (d) A description of SHORTFALLS IN STAFFING AND FUNDING, AS  
37 WELL AS opportunities to maximize and increase available resources and  
38 funding; and

39 (e) A description of gaps in and conflicts with existing funding,  
40 services, and programming essential to the effective restoration of  
41 competency for juveniles and adults;

1           (f) IDENTIFICATION OF ANY IN-CUSTODY AND OUTPATIENT  
2 RESTORATION PROGRAMS THAT HAVE BEEN OR WILL BE DEVELOPED  
3 CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 16-8.5-113.5; AND

4           (g) DATA ON ANY WAITING LIST FOR INPATIENT TREATMENT WITH  
5 A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE WAITING LIST IS MANAGED AND PRIORITIZED  
6 FOR RESTORATION SERVICES FOR ALL AVAILABLE SETTINGS.".

7 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

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
