## HOUSE COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AMENDMENT

Committee on Judiciary.SB18-252 be amended as follows:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 28, after line 12 insert:

2 "SECTION 12. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-60-105, amend  
3 (5) as follows:

4 **27-60-105. Outpatient restoration to competency services -**  
5 **legislative declaration - responsible entity - duties - report.** (5) On or  
6 before January 1, ~~2019~~ 2020, and every January 1 thereafter, the office  
7 shall submit an annual written report to the general assembly  
8 summarizing the office's provision of competency EVALUATION AND  
9 restoration ~~education~~ SERVICES and its efforts toward the coordination of  
10 competency restoration ~~education~~ SERVICES with other existing services.  
11 The report must include:

12 (a) Data on the number of individuals ordered to FOR competency  
13 restoration services EVALUATIONS, the average time frame for beginning  
14 and ending such services IN WHICH EVALUATIONS ARE BEING COMPLETED,  
15 the types of settings in which competency restoration services THE  
16 EVALUATIONS are provided, and the outcomes of such services THE  
17 NUMBER OF EVALUATIONS CONDUCTED IN EACH SETTING, AND THE  
18 RECOMMENDATION OF THE OPINION OF THE EVALUATOR SUBMITTED TO  
19 THE COURT;

20 (a.5) DATA ON THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS ORDERED TO  
21 COMPETENCY RESTORATION SERVICES, THE LIST OF ALL SETTINGS IN  
22 WHICH COMPETENCY RESTORATIONS WERE PROVIDED, THE NUMBER OF  
23 INDIVIDUALS SERVED IN EACH OF THE COMPETENCY RESTORATION  
24 SETTINGS, THE AVERAGE LENGTH OF TIME FROM BEGINNING TO END FOR  
25 RESTORATION OF COMPETENCY IN EACH SETTING, AND THE OUTCOMES OF  
26 RESTORATION SERVICES IN EACH SETTING;

27 (b) A description of the office's engagement with community  
28 partners to coordinate competency restoration services in an effective and  
29 efficient manner;

30 (c) Identification of best and promising practices for education  
31 and coordination of competency restoration services;

32 (d) A description of SHORTFALLS IN STAFFING AND FUNDING, AS  
33 WELL AS opportunities to maximize and increase available resources and  
34 funding; and

35 (e) A description of gaps in and conflicts with existing funding,  
36 services, and programming essential to the effective restoration of  
37 competency for juveniles and adults;

38 (f) IDENTIFICATION OF ANY IN-CUSTODY SERVICES AND  
39 OUTPATIENT RESTORATION PROGRAMS THAT HAVE BEEN OR WILL BE  
40 DEVELOPED CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 16-8.5-113.5;  
41 AND

1 (g) DATA ON ANY WAITING LIST FOR INPATIENT TREATMENT WITH  
2 A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE WAITING LIST IS MANAGED AND PRIORITIZED  
3 FOR RESTORATION SERVICES FOR ALL AVAILABLE SETTINGS."

4 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

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
