Summary Information

Overview. The bill repeals the Business Intelligence Center Advisory Board.**Types of impacts.** The bill repeals an advisory board that is scheduled to repeal under current law; thus, the bill has no fiscal impact on state or local government.**Appropriations.** No appropriation is required.

Summary of Legislation

The bill repeals the Business Intelligence Center Advisory Board on September 1, 2026, as recommended by the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) in its [2025 sunset review](#).

Background

The advisory board is primarily responsible for assisting the Secretary of State in operating the Business Intelligence Center, which is a program that seeks to streamline access to public data throughout the state. The committee had no revenue or expenditures in FY 2023-24 or FY 2024-25, and has not met since 2022.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill repeals an advisory board that has been inactive since 2022 and has no revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 13, 2026, and takes effect August 12, 2026, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
